Hidden homelessness: a national emergency

- Nearly two thirds of all people living in temporary accommodation are women.
- 8% of households found to be homeless or at risk of homelessness lost their last settled home due to domestic abuse. This means that there are thousands of women and their families trying to recover from severe trauma in unsafe, inadequate accommodation.
- The majority of households living in temporary accommodation are single mothers and this number has increased by 56% in the last five years in England.



More women than ever need your help

Many people associate homelessness with men and it's true that more men than women are recorded as living on the streets. However, England is facing a hidden crisis of women being homeless in temporary accommodation.

This temporary accommodation is often insecure and in poor condition. Mould, infestations and pests are also common. This can have an impact on women's and children's physical and mental health, as well as children's education.

Mel's story clearly shows the devastating effects of the growing housing emergency on women. Her young daughter suffered severe asthma because of the damp and mould in their temporary accommodation.

Mel didn't feel safe. There was no one to help if her abusive ex-husband returned or if her daughter had a life-threatening asthma attack.

This is just one example from thousands of how dangerous homelessness can be for women and their families.
