

APPENDIX: METHOD AND ADDITIONAL TABLES

Methodology

Calculating the scale of the problem

Most of the figures in this report are based on analysis of MHCLG's statutory homelessness statistics. The number of people living in temporary accommodation is the estimated number of people (adults plus children) who live in households that have been found to be homeless and are living in council-arranged temporary accommodation. The number of adults living in temporary accommodation is calculated using the detailed household type information about households living in temporary accommodationⁱ and added to figures for the number of children in temporary accommodation.ⁱⁱ 'Other' household types are assumed to contain an average of two people. Data from 2020 Q2 is used wherever possible but if it is not available for a given local authority, the most recent available quarter in the last year is used.ⁱⁱⁱ

We compared the number of homeless people living in temporary accommodation with the total number of people in each local authority to adjust our results for population size, and calculate the rates of homeless people living in temporary accommodation in each area.^{iv} These rates are available at national, regional and local authority level.

Sharing stories

We conducted telephone interviews with 21 people who lived in temporary accommodation during lockdown this year. The questionnaire included a mix of close and open-ended questions, allowing us to see trends, and allowing people to set out their thoughts and experiences in their own words. We asked people to describe their accommodation, talk about life during lockdown and to talk about the impact that living in temporary accommodation has had on them and, where appropriate, their children. These stories illustrate the breadth of experience of people living in TA.
