Research Report Food for thought: applying house price inflation to grocery prices

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Introduction

This paper looks at the inflation in house prices from 1971 to 2011 and applies it to the cost of everyday groceries, in order to emphasise how out of control house prices are.

Methodology

Information on house price inflation was sourced from the ONS House Price Index tables (<u>table</u> 22, formerly DCLG live table 502).

Average price in 1971: £5,632 Average price in 2011: £245,319

This gives an inflation of 43.56 times; that is to say house prices in 2011 were 43.56 times those in 1971.

This inflation multiplier was then applied to the 1971 prices of a range of groceries. These prices were sourced from the Office for National Statistics. Extra calculations were applied to those goods which are priced per kilo to give an idea of the cost of a standard portion or package. A full list of the new prices is given in the appendix.

In addition, the average expenditure on food for a four-person household was sourced from the 1971 Family Expenditure Survey. The multiplier was also applied to this.



Key Findings

If grocery prices had increased at the same rate as house prices since 1971, then:

- A 4-pint carton of milk would cost £10.45
- A chicken would cost £51.18
- A bunch of 6 bananas would cost £8.47
- A box of 6 eggs would cost £5.01
- A loaf of sliced white bread would cost £4.36
- A leg of lamb would cost £53.18
- The average weekly expenditure on food for a family of four would be £453.23.
