Last year, over **274,000 people** were made homeless in England, including **126,000 children**. This winter, many more will struggle to find a safe and warm place to call home.

The housing emergency is getting worse, and we desperately need real and lasting change. So, rally your students, lace up your trainers and join us on the journey to end homelessness.

IT'S TIME TO WALK FOR HOME.

How it works

Walk For Home is our winter walking event to help end homelessness.

This year, we are inviting schools to join walkers across the country to raise money and help families find a warm and safe place to call home.

1. PICK A DATE

Walk with students between 1st and 8th December.

2. PLAN YOUR ROUTE

You can walk as far as you like, wherever you like. Walk a mile, do laps of your playground or let your students decide.

3. PREPARE YOUR CLASS

Remind the children to bring warm layers, a hat and scarf to prepare them for a cold day out.

4. GET FUNDRAISING





Once you've planned the big day, it's time to think about fundraising. Encourage each child to bring in a contribution on the day of your walk. If each child brings £1, it will all add up to make a big difference.

Use one of our sponsorship forms or better still, set up a JustGiving page and encourage your students to get sponsored online.

You could motivate your students by setting a goal. Make fundraising a competition between classes or year groups to see who can raise the most.

- Challenge your superstar students to wear the wackiest hat to keep them warm on their walk
- * Add some tinsel to make it festive

- Host a bake sale on the same day, your walkers deserve a treat




SChool Resources and Lesson Plans

COULD FUND SOMEONE'S FIRST STEP TO A HOME

£6 could enable someone to get in touch with Shelter's specialised legal team who can help them take their first steps in the fight for their home.

£29

£29 could fund an emergency call to our helpline, giving someone or maybe even a family a fighting chance in the face of homelessness.

£23
