# ROVANIEMI

Nestled on the Arctic Circle, Rovaniemi serves as the official hometown of Santa Claus and the capital of Finnish Lapland. While it's a functional commercial and municipal centre where locals live and work, it lacks the romanticised charm of more remote Lapland destinations. However, Rovaniemi is a convenient gateway to the region, blending modern amenities with access to Lapland's wilderness and cultural experiences.

#### **GETTING TO ROVANIEMI**

By Air: Rovaniemi Airport is located 10 km from the city centre. Taxis are readily available during flight arrivals. Alternatively, Santa's Express (run by Pikakuljetus Rovaniemi Oy travels to the city centre, train station, Santa Claus Village, and Santa Park for €3.50 while the Airportbus connects the airport to the city's bus terminal and several hotels for €7-12 per person.

By Train or Bus: Both stations are about 1 km from the city centre, with taxi services available nearby. Rovaniemi's well-connected rail and bus links make it an ideal starting point for exploring Lapland.





#### **CULTURE FASCINATIONS**

#### Santa Claus Village & Santa Park


Meet Santa every day of the year at the Santa Claus Village or visit Santa Park, a whimsical underground cavern offering activities for all ages. The Santa Claus Main Post Office, part of Finland's official postal network, allows visitors to send holiday greetings stamped with Santa's unique Arctic Circle postmark.

Santa Claus Secret Forest – Joulukka – Alternatively you could step straight into a fairytale at Joulukka, which is situated only 16 kilometres from Rovaniemi, deep in the Finnish forest. In Joulukka you can explore Santa's command centre with the help from the elves and meet Santa himself in enchanting surroundings.

Winter Activities - During the winter months, embrace the Arctic winter with activities like snowmobiling, husky sledding, and reindeer safaris. For a more tranquil experience, try cross-country skiing or snowshoeing in the snow-covered landscapes.

Ranua Wildlife Park - About an hour's drive from Rovaniemi, this is the northernmost zoo in the world, home to polar bears, lynxes, elk, and over 50 other species of Arctic animals.

Arktikum Science Centre & Museum - Explore the history, culture, and nature of the Arctic region through interactive exhibits and displays. This striking building also provides an ideal vantage point for viewing the northern lights during winter.









#### **SHOPPING**

If you need to do any shopping, the city centre is the right place to go. There you'll also find shopping centres, such as <u>Sampokeskus</u> and <u>Rinteenkulma</u>. If you're souvenir hunting, Santa Claus Village has a good selection of souvenirs available.

For design souvenirs and gifts, head to the Arctic Design Shop in city centre. This boutique shop has a selection of jewellery, home decor, textiles, books, food and clothing from upcoming Finnish designers.

## **GETTING AROUND**

Rovaniemi city centre is relatively small and you can walk to most places in the city. The bus is also an easy way to get around if you need to get outside the city centre. The bus to Santa Claus Village and Santa Park is line number 8, and the same bus also goes to the Railway station (check the direction).
