Hurtigruten, a leader in sustainable cruise travel, partners up with 50 Degrees North and their innovations are transforming travel as we know it!

Vancouver, BC November 8th 2019 - Scandinavian Travel Specialist, 50 Degrees North, is extremely proud to confirm their new global partnership with Hurtigruten, a leader in ecofriendly sea travel. Hurtigruten is leading a green revolution in sea travel through their introduction of three new hybrid exploration ships, starting with MS Roald Amundsen in 2019, which will significantly reduce their emissions.
