THE IMPACT OF THE 421-A EXTENSION

On April 20, 2024, the New York State Legislature enacted the State's FY2025 Budget, which, among other things, extended the construction completion deadline for projects in the now expired 421-a (16) Affordable Housing New York Program from June 15, 2026 to June 15, 2031. Developers of vested 421-a projects had until September 12, 2024, to file a Letter of Intent (LOI) with NYC's Department of Housing Preservation and Development (HPD) to qualify their project for the extension.

On October 16, 2024, HPD publicly released a data set that lists all LOI filings it received from developers. The data set lists 740 projects with 78,861 total units including duplicate entries. REBNY has analyzed the developer-submitted data published by HPD without adjustment.


These findings demonstrate the success of the completion deadline extension. With the City facing a severe housing shortage and new construction filings at persistently low levels, these units will provide a much needed boost to New York City's housing stock in all five boroughs in the coming years.

Projects by Size

- 404 projects (55%) contain 50 units or less.
- 177 projects (24%) contain between 51 and 149 units.
- 89 projects (12%) contain between 150 and 299 units.
- 70 projects (9%) contain 300 units or more.



- Anticipated Year of Completion Breakdown:
 - 5,770 units anticipate completion prior to 2026
 - 19,374 units anticipate completion in 2026
 - 22,573 units anticipate completion in 2027
 - 4,808 units anticipate completion in 2028
 - 3,358 units anticipate completion in 2029
 - 2,041 units anticipate completion in 2030
 - 20,937 units anticipate completion in 2031
- Borough Breakdown
 - 24% of the total project filings are in the Bronx, representing 14% of the total units.
 - 47% of the total project filings are in Brooklyn, representing 47% of the total units.
 - 11% of the total project filings are in Manhattan, representing 19% of the total units.
 - 16% of the total project filings are in Queens, representing 18% of the total units.
 - Less than 2% of the total project filings and units are in Staten Island.
- Nearly 80 percent of the projects will utilize Affordability Option B, under which 30% of units must be affordable with 10% at 70% AMI and 20% at 130% AMI.
 - Option B also accounts for 45,690 units.
- Council District 39 leads with 10,124 units in the pipeline
 - 2,539 will be affordable
- Assembly District 52 leads with 11,676 units in the pipeline
 - 3,010 will be affordable
- Senate District 26 leads with 12,954 units in the pipeline
 - 3,399 will be affordable





METHODOLOGY

This analysis relies on a NYC Open Data dataset submitted under New York State Real Property Tax Law Section 421-a Subdivision 16, which requires buildings seeking partial real estate tax exemption to adhere to specific deadlines for the commencement and completion of construction.

The data in question captured information provided by property owners, including ownership details, the expected number of dwelling units, affordable housing units, and both commencement and anticipated completion dates. While the data is collected directly from owners, the accuracy of this report is dependent on the correctness of the information provided. Although REBNY reviewed the data for consistency, HPD chose to keep duplicate filings of 421-a buildings based on repeated form user response. As such, the accuracy of the report is limited by the reliability of the inputs submitted under the law.



AFFORDABILITY OPTIONS

Option A:

- 25% affordable units.
- 10% at 40% AMI, 10% at 60% AMI, 5% at 130% AMI.
- No subsidies except tax-exempt bonds and 4% tax credits.

Option B:

- 30% affordable units.
- 10% at 70% AMI, 20% at 130% AMI.

Option C:

- 30% affordable units at 130% AMI.
- No subsidies.
- Cannot be south of 96th St. in Manhattan or in other designated areas.

Option E:

- 25% affordable units.
- 10% at 40% AMI, 10% at 60% AMI, 5% at 120% AMI.
- No subsidies except tax-exempt bonds and 4% tax credits.

Option F:

- 30% affordable units.
- 10% at 70% AMI, 20% at 130% AMI.

Option G:

- 30% affordable units at 130% AMI.
- No subsidies.
- Cannot be in the Manhattan Enhanced Affordability Area.
