WELCOME TO THE HOST CITY OF KIGALI, RWANDA

RWANDA

Rwanda is a country situated in Central Africa, bordered to the North by Uganda, to the East by Tanzania, to the South by Burundi and to the West by the Democratic Republic of Congo. Rwanda's total area is 26,338 Km², with a population density estimated to be 445 people per km².

Also known as "The Land of a Thousand Hills", Rwanda has 5 volcanoes, 23 lakes and numerous rivers, some forming the source of the River Nile. The country lies 75 miles south of the equator in the Tropic of Capricorn, 880 miles 'as the crow flies' west of the Indian Ocean and 1,250 miles east of the Atlantic Ocean - literally in the heart of Africa.

The Altitude ranges from 1000m to 4500m above the sea level. The Main water bodies are Lake Kivu, Lake Muhazi, Lake Ihema, Lake Bulera, Lake Ruhondo, Lake Mugesera. Rwanda's Vegetation ranges from dense equatorial forest in the north-west of the country to tropical savannah in the east. Main National Parks/Animal Reserves are Akagera, Volcanoes and Gishwati-Mukura National Parks.

KIGALI

The City of Kigali is the capital of Rwanda and is located at Rwanda's geographical heart. Occupying an area of 730km², the city is located at latitude 10°58' S and a longitude 30°07' E. The average annual precipitation rate is approximately, with an annual average high temperature of 27°C and annual average low temperature of 16°C. The City of Kigali is composed of three Districts namely Gasabo, Kicukiro and Nyarugenge. Gasabo is the largest district by geographical area at 429.3km², followed by Kicukiro (166.7km²) and Nyarugenge (134km²). The City of Kigali population is 1,745,555 per the fifth Rwanda Population and Housing Census (RPHC5).

The districts are also divided into 35 administrative sectors which in turn are divided into 161 Cells. The smallest administrative unit is the village, and the city is made up of 1,155 villages. The city borders the Gicumbi and Rulindo Districts of Northern Province, Bugesera and Rwamagana Districts of Eastern Province and Kamonyi District of Southern Province. Kigali is the most visited area in Rwanda. It houses several tourism sites, hotels, a centrally placed international airport and many sporting centres including the BK and Amahoro arenas, Kigali Golf Resort & Villas and Rwanda's Cricket Stadium, Kicukiro Oval.

A new International Airport in Bugesera to serve Kigali is under construction about 15 km to the east of the city. The City of Kigali, the capital city of Rwanda has seen rapid growth for the last two and half decades. It is among the fastest growing cities in Africa with an urbanization annual growth rate of 4% and it contributes over 41% of the national GDP which indicates the primacy of Kigali to the Rwandan economy.

This growth has been driven by visionary leadership in Rwanda which has helped transform the country from a low scale agrarian economy to an active player within the regional economy. Kigali has been at the centre of the transformation in Rwanda and is on the threshold of rapid economic growth.

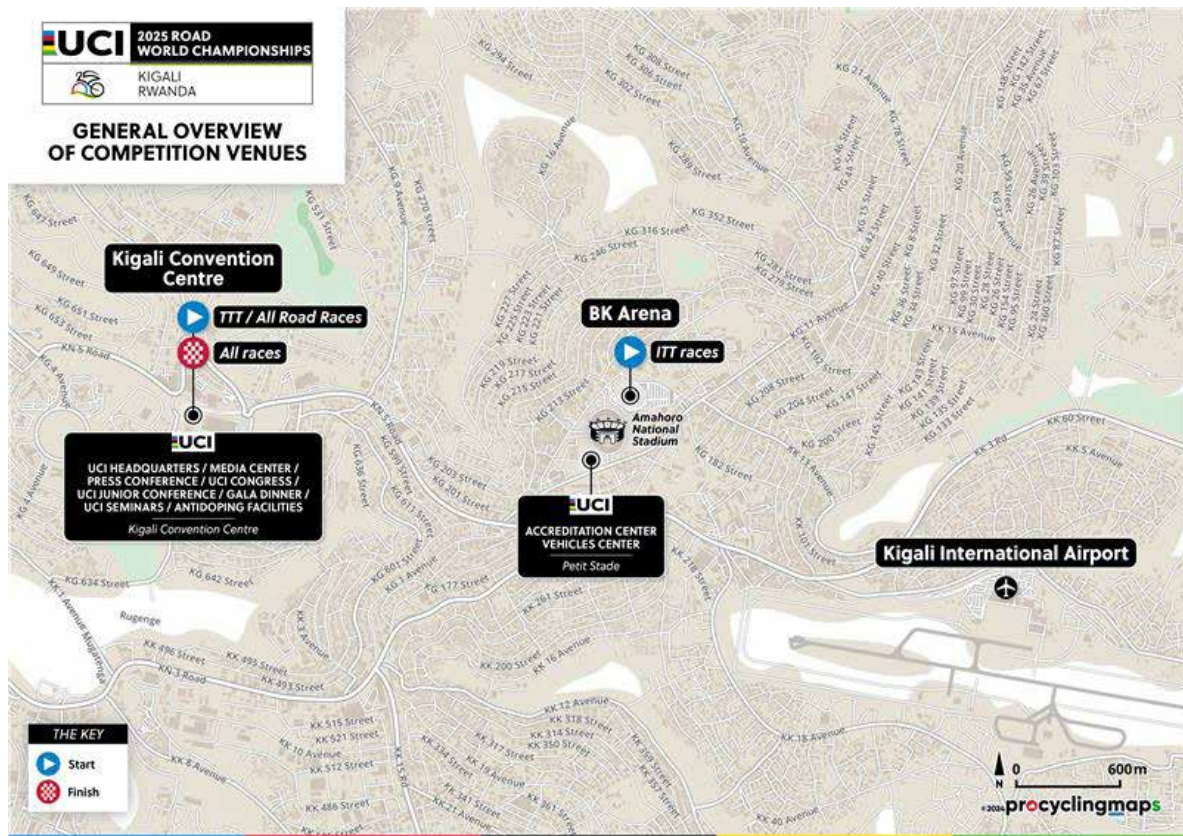

KIGALI EXTENSION CIRCUIT - MEN ELITE

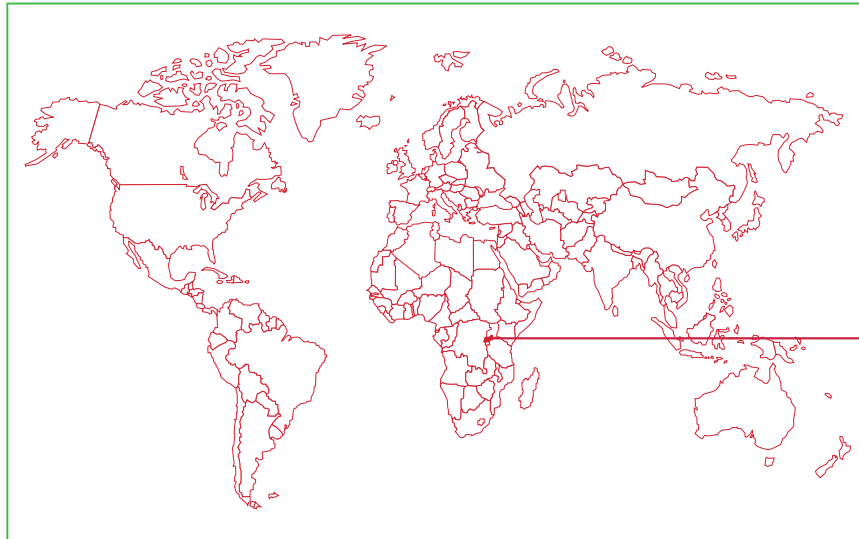

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HOW TO REACH KIGALI, RWANDA



COMING TO RWANDA



BY PLANE

All international flights arrive at Kigali International Airport, just 10km from Kigali city center.

Airlines servicing Kigali International Airport are: RwandAir, Kenya Airways, Ethiopian Airlines, EgyptAir, Brussels Airlines, KLM, Qatar Airways and Turkish Airlines.

Regional flights arrive at Kigali International Airport, which is 66 minutes flying time from Nairobi Kenya and 30 minutes flying time from Kampala, Uganda.

Other airports include Huye Airstrip, Kamembe Airport and Musanze Airstrip.

DAILY CONNECTIONS

RwandAir offers regular connections to: Abuja, Accra, Bangui, Brazzaville, Bujumbura, Cotonou, Dar Es Salaam, Douala, Entebbe, Harare, Johannesburg, Kamembe, Kilimanjaro, Lagos, Libreville, Lusaka and Nairobi. Prices will vary depending on the destination but in average the price should be around 300 USD for a return flight. Direct international flights travel to Brussels, London, Paris, Dubai and Doha. Prices vary by destination.

GETTING AROUND WITH LOCAL TRANSPORT IN KIGALI

Kigali is easy to move around, in fact most major attractions, conference venues and hotels are under a 15-minute drive from the city center.

It's a 15-minute drive from Kigali Airport to the city center or the Kigali Convention Center, and 10 minutes between the Kigali Convention Center and the city center.

Rwanda has a well-surfaced road network linking the major towns, and the most convenient way to travel the country is by car. Smaller roads are frequently unsurfaced with varying conditions, especially during rainy season. Tour operators can arrange a vehicle with driver, or several agencies rent out cars and 4x4s.

Taxis operate in the larger towns. Travel insurance may not cover motorbike taxis, which are also common.

There are no rail services and the most popular form of public transport is shared buses.

To rent a car in Rwanda, visitors can drive using their national driver's license. However, it is mandatory to always carry your driving license and original passport while driving. If you are from a country where the license isn't in English or French, it is recommended to have an International Driving Permit as well, to avoid any confusion.

BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Buses are the most common form of public transport in Kigali. Buses are modern, comfortable, and run on set schedules and routes. Destinations and routes are marked by the colors of the buses and a screen at the front. In Kigali, buses operate a smart card system called Tap&Go.

To board a bus, you'll need a "Tap & Go" card. These cards are available in every taxi park and most bus stops.

You can top the cards in the following ways:

- Visit vendors at the taxi parks and bus stops
- Using MTN Mobile Money by dialing *182*2*5#
- Downloading the Tap&Go app on your phone



BY TAXI OR RIDE-SHARE

The easiest mode of transport around Kigali is taxicabs, easily identified by the horizontal yellow stripe on the side of the vehicle.

While Uber is not available in Rwanda, there are a few alternatives. One of the most popular options is Volkswagen Mobility Solutions (MOVE). The majority of MOVE drivers speak English, and the cars are generally newer. However, this app requires a local Rwandan phone number, and availability can be limited. Depending on your location and the time of day, pickup wait times may reach 30-45 minutes during peak hours. You may choose to download the MOVE app on your phone or call 1010 to book a taxi.



Another option is the Rwanda taxi app, known as Yego Moto. This app allows you to hail both regular taxis and motorbike taxis, so be sure to adjust your rideshare settings accordingly. You can call them 9191. Yego Moto tends to have more vehicles available compared to MOVE, but drivers may not speak English.

IMMIGRATION & VISA PROCESS

VISA INFORMATION

All citizens of the world are issued a visa upon arrival at Kigali International Airport and all border posts without prior application.

Citizens of country members of the following international organizations; African Union, Commonwealth and La Francophonie get visa upon arrival and are waived visa fees for a visit of 30 days.

A citizen of East African Community Member States shall be issued a pass/entry visa free of charge upon arrival to stay for the period of six months.

The following countries to be granted 90 days valid visa free of charge upon arrival: Angola, Benin, Central African Republic, Chad, Cote d'Ivoire, Democratic Republic of Congo, The Federation of Saint Christopher and Nevis, Ghana, Guinea, Indonesia, Haiti, Mauritius, Philippines, Senegal, Seychelles, Sierra Leone, Sao Tome and Principe, Singapore and the state of Qatar.

The countries listed below are eligible for a 50 USD single entry visa or 70 USD multiple entry visa. This visa is valid for 30 days for single entry, or 90 days for multiple entries. The visa is paid for upon arrival to the airport and can be paid for by cash or card (excluding American Express).

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In principle, citizens from the following regions hold the corresponding passport and must follow the related entry requirements:

- Hong Kong and Macao → Chinese passport
- Bermuda, Anguilla, British Virgin Islands, Cayman Islands → British passport
- Aruba, Curaçao, Sint Maarten → Dutch passport
- Puerto Rico, Guam, U.S. Virgin Islands, American Samoa → U.S. passport
- Cook Islands → New Zealand passport

PASSPORT/TRAVEL DOCUMENT VALIDITY

All travellers must hold a valid passport or another acceptable travel document. The document must have a validity of at least 6 months on the day of entry in Rwanda.

VEHICLES ALLOCATED TO NATIONAL FEDERATIONS

A limited supply of team cars will be provided to the National Federations by the organizer and its vehicle partner on the same basis as during previous UCI Road World Championships. These cars will be assigned to the top-ranked National Federations according to the number of riders in their delegation. Information on the allocation of these vehicles to the National Federations, the location of the collection of the vehicles and the deposit will be detailed in the Technical Guide of the 2025 UCI Road World Championships which will be published mid-July.

All drivers representing National Federations in the race convoy at UCI Road World Championships must have a UCI Licence issued by a National Federation and are obliged to respect the UCI Regulations as well as the Guidelines for vehicle circulation in the race convoy. The UCI Licence must include the necessary third-party liability insurance in case of material damage or bodily injury to others, which must be valid in all countries where the licence-holder is susceptible of exercising his function.

Drivers are required to have an in-depth knowledge of cycle racing and its regulations and have the experience and ability to anticipate a wide range of race situations. It is a responsibility of the National Federation to ensure that their drivers have the required experience to drive in the race convoy at UCI Road World Championships.

Drivers remain responsible for their driving; if they fail to observe the regulations, they face significant financial penalties as well as suspensions of their UCI Licence (as a driver and any other role they may have). The sanctions related to driving in the race convoy are defined by Articles 2.2.038 and subsequent of the UCI Regulations.

Additionally, it is mandatory to always carry both the International Driving Permit and the driver's original passport while driving. To get an International Driving Permit, you need to apply through an authorized agency in your home country.

RADIO FREQUENCIES

In order to use radio equipment during the 2025 UCI Road World Championships, all cycling teams, broadcasters, press, and others must follow the following process:

1. Each stakeholder must complete a specific form including the following details:

- General information (name, country, representative, contact details, etc.)
- Number of radios and a list of their serial numbers
- List of radio frequencies generally used

This completed form must be submitted by September 1, 2025 to the following email address: uci2025secretariat@minisports.gov.rw. The form template will be posted on the [official Kigali 2025 website](#), in the Information for the National Federation section.

2. Each stakeholder will be informed of the assigned radio frequency for their use.

3. Upon arrival at the airport, the radio serial numbers will be verified by customs. Any radio serial number not listed on the provided form will be prohibited from use in Rwanda.

No fee or payment will be required for this application process, nor for the use of the radios in Rwanda.

CUSTOMS AND LOGISTICS

INTRODUCTION

National Federations traveling to Rwanda for the 2025 UCI Road World Championships are subject to specific customs regulations when importing bicycles, equipment, and related materials. The Rwanda Revenue Authority (RRA) offers a **Temporary Import Regime** allowing duty-free entry for items re-exported at the end of the Championships.

To ensure an efficient clearance and logistics experience, we recommend **working with a licensed freight forwarder/customs agent**.

GENERAL APPROACH

- All bicycles, biking equipment, and related materials arriving in Rwanda for the UCI Road World Championships will enter under the **Temporary Importation Regime** and must be re-exported after the event.
- **No customs duties or taxes** will be charged on these items if re-exported within the authorized time.
- An **insurance guarantee** (a financial security) is required to ensure the goods either leave Rwanda after the event or customs duties/taxes are paid if they do not.
- **Necessary Documents:** Invoices, packing lists, and proof of event participation (e.g., official invitation or registration letter).

TEAM DOCTORS

MEDICAL INSURANCE

All members of National Federations, including staff, athletes, and delegates, must ensure they have appropriate insurance(s) for illness and bodily injury before traveling to the event. The UCI and the Organising Committee do not provide any insurance coverage for attending the event.

In case medical treatment is required in a health center or hospital, whether following an incident in a race or not, an insurance certificate and/or a down payment may be required. In case a member of staff, an athlete or delegate fails to provide adequate insurance coverage, the cost for the treatment will be billed to the respective National Federation. If necessary to ensure necessary treatment is provided, the UCI reserves the right to pay for the treatment and demand reimbursement from the National Federation. The UCI may also refuse participation of athletes and/or staff members who do not hold adequate insurance.

To ensure adequate coverage, your insurance(s) for bodily injury and illness must:

- Take effect as soon as you leave your home country or place of residence.
- Be recognized by main referral hospitals in Kigali (list in the General Information section).

- Cover medical treatment in Rwanda.
- Include medical evacuation and treatment within Africa.
- Cover repatriation to your home country or place of residence.

For those in need of additional coverage, private health insurance providers in Rwanda offer packages that include medical treatment within Rwanda, medical evacuation and treatment in Africa, and repatriation to the home country or place of residence.

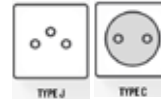

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GENERAL INFORMATION

- **Population:** 13 million residents
- **Time Zone:** time in Rwanda is given by a single time zone, officially denoted as Central Africa Time (CAT/ UTC+02:00). Rwanda has never observed daylight saving time.
- **Language:** Kinyarwanda, English, French and Kiswahili
- **Voltage:** 230V, AC 50Hz
- **Plug Type:** 220/240V AC. It is advisable to bring your own round, two-prong adapter and transformer for 110V AC.



Currency

The unit of currency is the Rwandan Franc (RWF). Exchange rates are subject to fluctuation.

Central bank rates can be found on the National Bank of Rwanda website <https://www.bnr.rw>. Bureau de Change (Forex Bureaus) are available at the airport and in all parts of Kigali City.

It is recommended to get cash in RWF to pay for local services, however visitors can also use credit/debit cards in Rwanda.

Banking services

Banking hours are from 09:00 to 17:30 on weekdays and from 08:00 to 15:00 on Saturdays.

Banking amenities are available at all commercial banks. Most banks have cash dispensing machines accepting Visa, MasterCard and Cirrus.

Most internationally recognized currencies and traveler's cheques can be exchanged at commercial banks, hotels and the international airport. Major credit cards are accepted in most hotels, restaurants and shops.

Weather

Average temperature in September: 21°-27°C. Average rainfall in September: 70mm/month.

Fractionally south of the Equator and with much of the country lying at altitude, Rwanda enjoys an agreeable tropical highland climate. Temperatures vary considerably between locations, but vary little from month to month. Peak temperatures rarely exceed 30°C (86°F) in the daytime or drop below 15°C (59°F) at night.

There are two rainy seasons in a year, from mid-February to May and mid-September to mid-December. The dry season, from June to mid-September, sees light cloud cover and occasional light rainfall. The roads and paths tend to be easier to navigate in this period.

Connectivity

Rwanda has an excellent mobile phone network covering almost the entire country, and international calls can be made easily. The country is among the top three African countries in terms of internet connectivity, with an ever-growing fiber optic network.

The following Rwandan mobile telecommunication service providers are available: MTN and Airtel.

Mobile telephone service providers also provide gateways to the internet using GPRS, 3G and 4G. Cell phone SIM/e-SIM cards are widely available. Every SIM card user/buyer in Rwanda is expected by law to be registered prior to activation. SIM cards can be registered at the point of purchase.

Kindly have your passport for SIM card registration. All hotels and many public places (e.g. cafes, restaurants) provide internet connectivity to visitors.

Safety

It is advised to always check with your country's embassy for the latest travel advise depending on your travel itinerary.

Health

General health advice for travellers to Rwanda

- **Vaccinations:** While there is no vaccine requirement to enter Rwanda, travellers should ensure they are up to date with vaccinations, following the advice of their local healthcare provider. A valid tetanus vaccination is highly recommended. Moreover, a small personal first-aid kit is also highly recommended.

- **Malaria:** Most of Rwanda lies at too high an elevation for malaria to be a major problem, but the agent responsible for the disease may be present and preventive measures are recommended.

Travellers should seek professional medical advice on taking anti-malarial medications as a preventive measure, but the most important thing is to take precautions to avoid mosquito bites, especially between dawn and dusk.

Travelers are advised to seek immediate medical attention and consult a doctor immediately if they experience symptoms such as high fever, headaches, joint and muscle pain, chills, sweating, fatigue, nausea and vomiting. Diagnosis and appropriate antimalarial treatment are available in all health establishments.

- **Yellow fever:** Though Rwanda is at low risk of yellow fever, a vaccination is only required for travelers from yellow fever endemic countries (see World Health Organization website for additional details). Vaccination must be taken 10 days before traveling to Rwanda. Travelers arriving from yellow fever endemic countries without a yellow fever vaccination certificate will be vaccinated upon entry. No entry is allowed to a traveler from an endemic country who fails to present a yellow fever certificate and does not consent to be vaccinated or quarantined. The cost related to quarantine and/or vaccination upon entry will be covered by the traveler.

- **Mpox:** Travelers should avoid prolonged skin-to-skin contact with sick people showing Mpox symptoms (skin rash, swollen lymph nodes, fever). Travelers should wash hands frequently with soap and water or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer. Seek immediate medical attention if you develop symptoms. Mpox vaccines are available for post-exposure prophylaxis. No preventive Mpox vaccine is required.

- **Marburg Virus Disease (MVD):** The Marburg Virus Disease (MVD) was officially declared over in Rwanda on 20 December 2024. No new cases were reported for 42 days after the last patient tested negative for the virus twice, as per the WHO protocol for ending such outbreaks.

As a small country, medical help is rarely far away in Rwanda. For basic treatment most towns of any size have pharmacies with a limited range of medicines, while larger towns have hospitals.

In case of medical evacuation, Akagera Aviation operates a helicopter ambulance service within Rwanda in daylight hours, with one military paramedic on call. Please make sure you have adequate medical insurance.

- **General health rules: It is advisable**

- not to drink tap water. Bottled mineral water can be bought in all towns – make sure the seal is intact.
- no raw foods, no ice cubes or ice cream, no fresh fruit juices
- not approach stray animals (especially dogs)
- avoid walking barefoot on wet floors
- regular hand washing, before and after meals

Plastic free Rwanda

Please refrain from bringing plastic bags to Rwanda. Banned by law since 2008, any plastic bags in your luggage will be confiscated at the airport. Single-use plastics have also been banned and are now being phased out. Please bring your own reusable water bottle with you.

Business & shopping hours

Public offices open from 09:00 to 17:00 while businesses open from 08:00 to 18:00, Monday to Friday. Weekend business hours range between 09:00 and 13:00, while shopping centers and boutiques remain open until late.

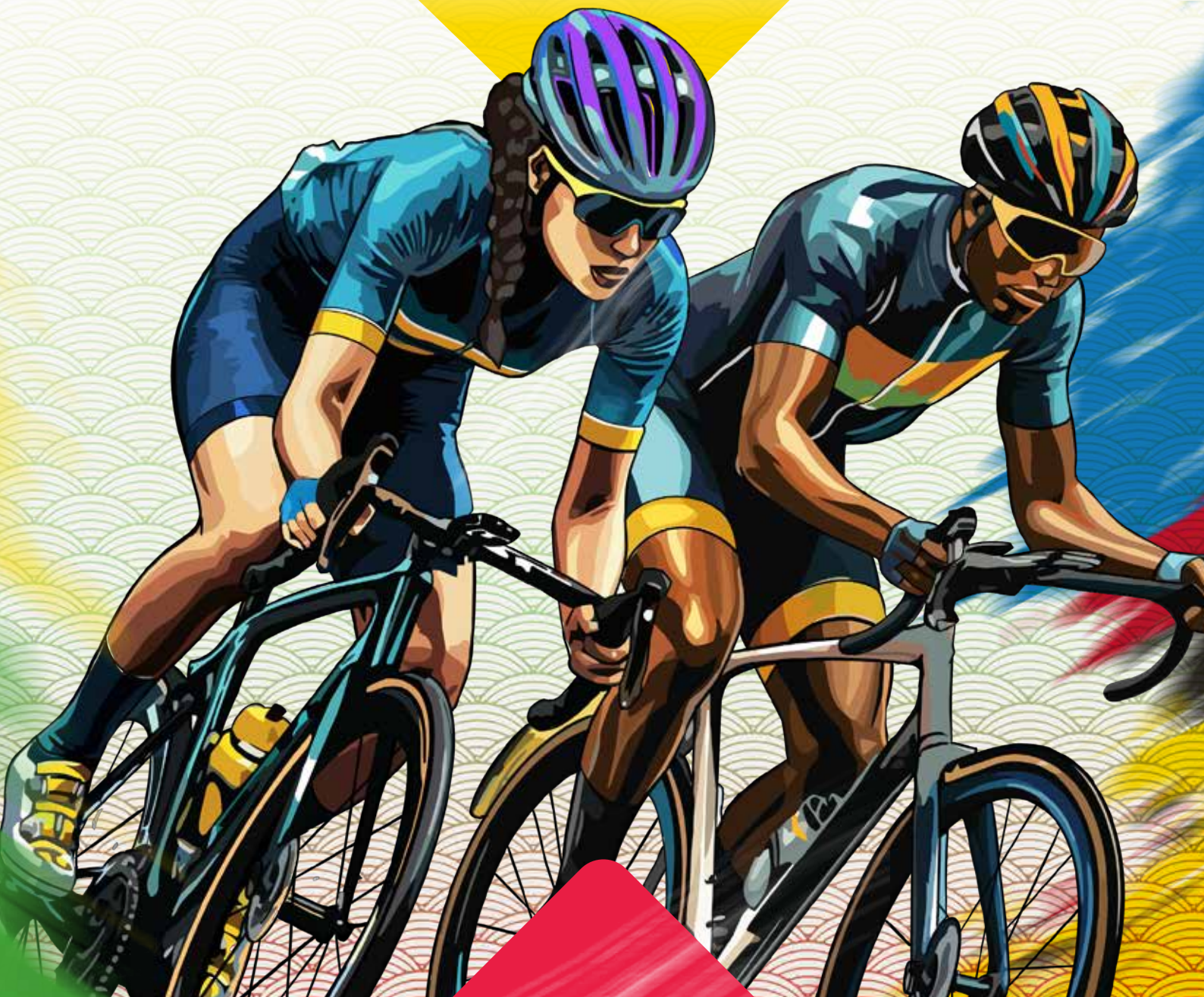
