# 1. ENTRY

All entry will be done through the UCI Regonline V2 new entry system. The system will open on 14 July and close on 28 July at 12:00 (CEST).

#### REGISTRATION FEE FOR NATIONAL FEDERATIONS 2.

The registration fee is € 100 per accredited person. (Refunds cannot be made for athletes who registered but didn't compete). Only the National teams that have paid the registration fee within the deadline will receive their accreditation passes and be able to take part in the competition. The deadline for payment is Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> of August 2025.

Countries need to show **proof of payment** when picking up the accreditations.



The accreditation is also mandatory to enter the backstage of the Ceremony podium. Riders may be accompanied by one team staff member in the Mixed Zone (e.g. Press Attaché with yellow team accreditation) & in the backstage for the podium ceremony.



National Federations can also apply for accreditations for Team Photographers & Videographers via Press en Media. They will receive a green bib & a green press accreditation.

Teams & competitors are most welcome for a ceremony which consists of a formal part in which the mayor of Ronse and the LOC will welcome everybody, and the UCI will declare that Championships are opened. After that there is an informal part with a local dance group and band on the artist stage.

Attendance is not mandatory for the nations.

# 12. CONFIRMATION OF STARTERS

You will need to produce your UCI race license at this meeting and bring racing kits to be checked by the Chief Commissaire. Team Managers may do this process on behalf of their team, providing they have all athletes' licenses and kit.

# 13. TEAM MANAGERS' MEETING

The team managers' meeting is an important pre-race activity that will provide team managers with key information about technical rules and event procedures. The technical briefing will equip team managers with vital information required to support their athletes on competition days. It is compulsory for each participating nation to have at least one representative from their team staff present. At the conclusion of the meeting, bib numbers, transponders and car stickers will be distributed.

# 14. CLASSIFICATION

PI Classification will take place at: CC De Ververij (Wolvestraat 37, 9600 Ronse, Belgium)

Any athlete who does not show up to the scheduled Classification time will be made CNC and will not be permitted to compete.

#### **Submission Of Classification Paperwork**

All athletes with a New, Review or Fixed Review Date 2025 or earlier must be present for all days of Classification to allow for scheduling. Athlete medical information must be uploaded to their profile on PCSAS. Nations who do not yet have a PCSAS account must request access via <a href="mailto:classification@uci.ch">classification@uci.ch</a>.

#### **Adaptation Checks**

Adaptation checks will take place on 27 August. A schedule will be communicated prior to the day. All athletes who have modifications to their equipment must present for adaptation checks. Information on adaptations must be uploaded to PCSAS prior to their appointment.

# 15. START LIST

Provisional entry lists is available on the <u>UCI website</u>. The definitive list of starters and detailed start list will be available after the team manager's meeting.

# 16. RACE NUMBERS

Race numbers will be assigned after the confirmation of starters and distributed at the team managers' meeting. C, T, and B division athletes must wear 1 number for the individual time trial and 2 with the frame plate for the Road Race.

H class riders must wear identifying numbers (either stickers or bib numbers) on both sides and the frame plate mounted to the safety bar for individual Time Trial and Individual Road Race.

Team relay numbers will be distributed before the race starts on Sunday Morning after the specific Team Relay Meeting.

# 17. TRANSPONDERS

All athletes are required to use transponders. A deposit of €50 per athlete, capped at €500 per team, is payable upon confirmation of athlete participation during the Confirmation of Staters. Transponders will be distributed to team managers after the Team Managers Meeting on 27 August.

# 18. EQUIPMENT

H and T class riders are required to use the safety bar for both Individual Time Trial and Individual Road Race.

# 19. VEHICLE ACCREDITATION

Any team or support vehicles who wish to utilize the official team parking and/or access the field of play must submit their vehicle details during the accreditation process.

Your vehicle will be turned away from official event spaces if it does not have a Vehicle Accreditation.

# 20. TEAM AREA & PARKING

The Teams Area is located behind CC De Ververij. Please follow the PPO-North or PPO-South if you come to Ronse by car. From the PPO (Point Passage Obligatoire) you need to follow the event signalization '**Teams'**. See below.


In general, you can park 1 car in the Teams Area per country. If your country has booked units (container + tent + parking space next to each other), then you can park 1 car per unit you've booked. Countries who didn't book a unit will share a common parking lot (1 place) & a common tent in the Teams Area.

It is mandatory for all countries to use the Teams Area and the Teams parkings due to strict mobility & safety plan in the City of Ronse. There are no other public locations in Ronse where you can be parked. Local police & LOC will control this.

The back-up team car parking is only for additional team cars, so tents, trucks, etc... are not allowed.

**All containers must be locked by the countries** every day. During the day there is access control to the Teams Area.

Please be aware that there is **no catering** service provided by the LOC in the Teams Area.





# 21. RACE ROUTE MANAGEMENT

A large fleet of police and safety motorcycles will operate during official training and competition times to ensure the safety of all athletes involved.

During the race, there will also be motorbikes with cameras from the Host Broadcaster VRT.

# 22. NEUTRAL SERVICE

**Shimano** will provide neutral service. Basic repairs will be available but not for structural repairs.

A document with the list of equipment in the neutral cars is available on the UCI website.

# 23. TEAM CARS

Team cars are permitted to follow athletes during time trials. Drivers must have a UCI license as well as a driving license or international driving license valid in **Belgium**.

NO team cars are allowed in the road race convoys. Teams can service riders at the feed zone on the road race course. If neutral service is unable to get an athlete back on the road, a broom wagon service is available to get athletes and their cycles back to the start / finish.

# 24. POST-RACE

Finish Line Process – once an athlete finishes their race, they are required to pass through the Media Mixed Zone where they may be interviewed by Media / TV, which will be managed by LOC Media Team. Upon leaving the Mixed Zone, athletes will be directed to team parking, anti-doping or victory ceremony waiting area. Chaperones will be on hand to assist in this process.

A **hot spot** will be run for all Para-cycling Individual Time Trial Races. Provisional leader of each race of the respective class will be required to take a place in the dedicated area according to their placement.

Ceremonies will run from almost immediately after the race to a few hours after the race finishes. We ask that team staff be prepared to bring day wheelchairs or athlete person needs to the medal area should the ceremony be within 45 minutes after the competition. Medalists without immediate medal ceremonies will be asked to return to the ceremony area 30 minutes prior to their scheduled ceremony time. Please note on many days the Plaza will be very crowded, and it will take time to reach the ceremony waiting area.

Award Ceremonies times will be posted on the final schedule. Athletes who take part in a victory ceremony must wear their competition uniform. Sunglasses are not permitted unless medically required. Headwear is not permitted, however, by exception the wearing of headwear for religious purposes is permitted.

# 25. DOPING CONTROL STATION

All anti-doping checks take place at **Huis van de mens, Zuidstraat 13, Ronse.** This is very close to the finish line. There will be event signalization to the antidoping from the Teams Area & the Plaza.

Doping Control Officers and chaperones, will be on site and notify any athlete who has been selected for the doping control. Chaperones will guide selected athletes and support staff to the doping control station.

# 26. VISAS

Each federation is responsible for obtaining the necessary documentation to enter Belgium.

Every person seeking to enter Belgium must be in possession of a valid passport for travel to Belgium and, where necessary, a visa. Enquiries can be directed to Belgium diplomatic representatives abroad or the Department of Home Affairs in Brussels. Visitors who intend to

travel to Belgium's neighboring countries and back into Belgium are advised to apply for multiple entry visas. Visas are not issued on arrival at Belgium ports of entry.

#### **Visa Requirements:**

- Passport valid for no less than 30 days after the expiry of the intended visit;
- Passports must contain at least one unused page for entry or departure endorsements;
- o Payment of the prescribed fee, if applicable;
- A vaccination certificate, if required by the Act;
- Statement and/or documentation confirming purpose and duration of visit;
- Two identity photographs (see website for details);
- o Proof of financial means; and A return / onward ticket;
- O In terms of existing arrangements, passport holders of certain countries are exempt from visa requirements. Tourists must satisfy immigration officers that they have the means to support themselves during their stay, and that they are in possession of return or onward air tickets. They must also have valid international health certificates.


# 29. CLIMATE CONDITION

#### Climate






**Thursday 28 August And Friday 29 August – Time Trials** 




Saturday 30 August - Road Race - H1, H2, T1, T2






