

# 2025 UCI Mountain Bike International Calendar Continental Series

## **1. UCI Mountain Bike International Calendar**

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You will find the 2025 UCI MTB International Calendar on the [UCI website](#).

Minimum number of events per format, per continent: no minimum set for the first year

Maximum number of events per format, per continent: 6

A Continental Series cannot take place at the same time as a UCI Mountain Bike World Championships, a UCI Mountain Bike World Cup or a Continental Championships of the same format.

A Continental Series race is applicable only for Cross-country and Downhill events as qualification pathway for the UCI Mountain Bike World Cup.

The Calendar Registration fee applied is as per HC class.

## **2. UCI Regulations**

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### a. UCI Ranking and UCI points

The UCI Mountain Bike Rankings are drawn up over a period of one year.

Continental Series: the best 5 results of each rider are taken into consideration for the UCI Ranking, no matter the continent where the event is taking place.

The UCI Ranking is calculated every Tuesday and are published on the [UCI website](#).

The points scale is available in annexes 2 and 3 of the [UCI Mountain Bike Regulations](#)

### b. Participation

Entries are open to any UCI license holder, except Masters

- Riders belonging to a UCI MTB TEAM or a UCI MTB WORLD SERIES TEAM
- There is no quota limitation for the National Federations
- Any rider can participate, no matter the country or the continent

### c. Registration

Entry should be made directly with each race organiser or the relevant Continental Confederation, if applicable, under the terms that apply to that event.

Registration fees are as set by each race organiser but cannot exceed the maximum amount of:

- EUR 80.- per rider in Europe
- EUR 50.- per rider on other continents

d. Start Order

The start order is determined as per the [UCI Mountain Bike Regulations](#), articles 4.2.061 for XCO and 4.3.001 for DHI.

### 3. Continental Series Standings

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The overall standings take into account the 4 best results per rider per continent.

The points scale is available at annexes 2 and 3 of the [UCI Mountain Bike Regulations](#)

The overall standings are drawn up by the Continental Confederations.

### 4. Continental Series qualification pathway to the UCI Mountain Bike World Cup

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The riders can qualify for the UCI Mountain Bike World Cup in Cross-country and Downhill as follows:

XCO - men elite (aged 23 and over)	1. Top five riders of <b>any round</b> of a Continental Series limited to <b>1 round</b> of the current UCI MTB World Cup (GoldenTicket)
XCO - women elite (aged 23 and over)	2. Top five riders from the <b>final standings</b> of any of the Continental Series of the previous year, Elite (from 2026) 3. Top five riders from the <b>final standings</b> of any of the Continental Series of the previous year, U23 (if progressing into Elite category) (from 2026)
XCO - men under 23 (aged from 19 to 22)	1. Top five riders of <b>any round</b> of a Continental Series, limited to <b>1 round</b> of the current UCI MTB World Cup (Golden Ticket)
XCO - women under 23 (aged from 19 to 22)	2. Top five riders from the <b>final standings</b> of any of the Continental Series of the previous year, U23 (from 2026) 3. Top five riders from the <b>final standings</b> of any of the Continental Series of the previous year, Junior (if progressing into U23 category) (from 2026)

The qualification criteria listed above are not applicable for riders member of a UCI MTB WORLD SERIES TEAM. As a matter of clarification, the riders member of a UCI MTB WORLD SERIES TEAM can participate in the race but they cannot pretend to a qualification quota for the UCI Mountain Bike World Cup.

## 5. Team area

UCI MTB WORLD SERIES TEAMS and UCI MTB TEAMS can benefit of 30m2 free paddock are. Extra meters are to paid directly with the organiser.

## 6. Prize Money

Minimum prize money is as per the [UCI financial obligations](#), linked to the Elite category event as published on the UCI Mountain Bike international calendar – See table below:
