MERCEDES-BENZ UCI MOUNTAIN BIKE WORLD CUP



A BRIEF RUNDOWN

THE UCI MOUNTAIN BIKE WORLD CUP HAS A LONG, COLOURFUL HISTORY AND ENJOYS A SOLID FOLLOWING THROUGHOUT THE WORLD. OVER THE YEARS, THE UCI HAS MODIFIED THE FORMAT AND INTRODUCED NEW INITIATIVES IN ORDER TO KEEP UP WITH EVOLVING TRENDS AND MEET THE EXPECTATIONS OF ATHLETES AND FANS.

EVOLUTION OF THE UCI MOUNTAIN BIKE WORLD CUP

1991

It was 24 years ago that two American riders, John Tomac and Sara Ballantyne, became the first winners of the UCI Mountain Bike World Cup. The year was 1991, and the World Cup series comprised nine rounds in seven countries, catering for cross-country Olympic (XCO) specialists only.

1993

Two years later the downhill (DHI) format joined the programme, crowning two German athletes this time: Jürgen Beneke and Regina Stiefl. Interestingly, John Tomac, XCO winner in 1991, took second place in the inaugural downhill World Cup as well as second in the XCO.

1998 - 2001

1998 was the year that the dual slalom – the forerunner of four-cross – made its debut in the World Cup. Dual-slalom involved knock-out heats with two riders racing on parallel courses, and it featured in the World Cup for four years. American Brian Lopes and Australian Katrina Miller won the overall classification the first year.

2002 - 2011

After four years on the programme, the dual-slalom was replaced by fourcross (4X) in which four riders race against each other on a single course. Winner of three of the four dual-slalom World Cups, Brian Lopes went on to dominate the first year of four-cross. In the women's competition victory went to France's Anne-Caroline Chausson, already winner of the dual-slalom in 2000.

2012-2014

Cross-country Eliminator was the next mountain bike format to join the UCI Mountain Bike World Cup, from 2012 to 2014. This spectacular format for XCO specialists sees four competitors race head-to-head over a lap of around a kilometre. Introduced to the World Cup with three events in 2012, six Eliminator rounds appeared in 2013 and 2014 with the overall classifications going to Belgium's Fabrice Mels and Switzerland's Kathrin Stirnemann.

2018

2018 sees the addition of cross-country short track (XCC) racing into the overall XCO UCI Mountain Bike World Cup competition. The goal with this new discipline is to continue developing cross-country.

INTRODUCTION OF FORMATS









CROSS-COUNTRY OLYMPIC (XCO)

Cross-country Olympic format races are held overundulating circuits (with technical descents, forestroads, rocky paths and obstacles) of 4 to 6 km, which riders must complete several times. The Elite racing times, for men and women, vary from 1h20 minutes to 1h40. An attractive course design that shows the discipline well on television and is also spectator friendly is a necessity!

CROSS-COUNTRY SHORT TRACK (XCC)

Cross-country short track is a variation of Cross-country Olympic. The start and finish must be in the same area. The distance of the course must not be more than 2 km with a race duration of 20 to 60 minutes. Natural and/or artificial obstacles are only permitted if their use has been approved beforehand by the UCI Technical Delegate or, in his absence, the president of the commissaires' panel.

DOWNHILL (DHI)

Downhill is a race against the clock in which the rider negotiates a succession of fast and technical passages. The participant must demonstrate courage as well as sharp technical and piloting skills in order to battle tree roots, rocks, banked sections, bumps, jumps and other natural obstacles along the way.

YEAR-ON-YEAR GROWING AUDIENCE ON RED BULL TV AND A LARGE TV AUDIENCE REFLECTS THE ENHANCED BROADCAST OFFER.

UCI's official partner, Red Bull Media House produced the 2019 Mercedes-Benz UCI Mountain Bike World Cup and did broadcast the series for the seventh consecutive year after delivering a 12% increase in viewership compared to 2018. The broadcast was experienced through Red Bull TV, the company's free, on demand platform available on the web and as an app on Smart TVs, mobile phones, gaming consoles and more. With 62 hours of live programming, UCI fans worldwide had access to every stop of the World Cup without geo-blocks that traditionally come with live sports.

Beside the live broadcasts, Red Bull Media House also produced recap programs and a large number of additional clips for fans to go beyond race day and dive deep into the competitors, race locations and latest news on the sport. The additional programming was syndicated through Red Bull Media House's owned and managed channels including RedBull. com and on social media.

In 2019, the partnership continued to secure a large TV audience. Over 10 million TV viewers followed the 10 rounds of the 2018 Mercedes-Benz UCI Mountain Bike World Cup Series by watching either the live broadcasts or delayed summaries. In total, 44 broadcasters from 110 countries followed the 2019 Mercedes-Benz UCI Mountain Bike World Cup with different editorial coverage, such as live broadcasts, live summaries, recap programmes, short reports or news and reached a cumulative audience on linear TV of almost 82 million viewers.

ALBSTADT | GERMANY XCO/XCC

The German venue will organise an XCO round of the UCI Mountain Bike World Cup for the eighth time since it first joined the calendar in 2013. The Albstadt bike park was created in 2004 and features a combination of physically demanding passages and technical sections.

The venue in southwest Germany is popular with XCO riders, some of whom use it to prepare for the World Cup. The 2021 Mercedes-Benz UCI Mountain Bike World Cup will return to Albstadt after missing a year on the calendar because COVID-19 pandemic forced the organisers to cancel the 2020 UCI Mountain Bike World Championships.





NOVE MESTO NA MORAVE CZECH REPUBLIC

XCO/XCC

The XCO specialists will put their skills to the test in the Czech Republic. A regular host of the Mercedes-Benz UCI Mountain Bike World Cup and voted "best event" of the series eight times, Nove Mesto na Morave also hosted the UCI Mountain Bike Cross-country Olympic World Championships in 2016.


A popular stand-out feature of the XCO course is the start/finish area in the impressive biathlon stadium, where the 2013 Biathlon World Championships took place.



FORT WILLIAM | GREAT BRITAIN DHI

After first joining the UCI World Cup in 2002, this British stopover features on the calendar for the 18th time. Also host of the 2007 UCI Mountain Bike & Trials World Championships, this spot in the Scottish Highlands is a not to-be-missed destination on the DHI calendar. Clear evidence of this was that Fort William has been voted several times winner of the "best event" award.





LEOGANG AUSTRIA XCO/XCC - DHI

The Saalfelden-Leogang bike park opened in 2001 and has become one of the most popular European meetings for downhillers. The Austrian winter sports resort, not far from Salzburg, joined the UCI Mountain Bike World Cup in 2010 and hosted the 2012 UCI Mountain Bike World Championships (DHI/4X) followed by the 4X Worlds in 2013 and 2014. With its spectacular views, Leogang once again promises to be sensational.

Following a successful edition of the 2020 UCI Mountain Bike World Championships presented by Mercedes-Benz, the traditional downhill venue will now host Cross-country races as well. This event will be the first double header of the 2020 season.



LES GETS | FRANCE XCO/XCC - DHI

The Mercedes-Benz UCI Mountain Bike World Cup moves to Les Gets, after the French alpine resort hosted the 2004 UCI Mountain Bike & Trials World Championships and a round of the 2019 UCI Mountain Bike World Cup. Les Gets, which also hosted rounds of the UCI World Cup in 1998, 2000, 2002 and 2019, will again organise the UCI Mountain Bike World Championships in 2022. Les Gets makes maximum use of its territory by organising the XCO races on one side of the valley and the DHI competitions on the other side.





MARIBOR | SLOVENIA

DHI

Maribor is no stranger to organising UCI Mountain Bike events as the resort has been the host of UCI World Cup rounds from 1999 to 2002, from 2007 to 2010, in 2019 and in 2020.

Bike Park Pohorje regularly hosts mountain bike racing, and its World Cup trail has been internationally renowned since it first organised a round of the UCI series over 20 years ago. Bringing the UCI Mountain Bike World Cup back to Maribor is part of the strategic development of mountain bike tourism in Maribor and the region of Styria.



LENZERHEIDE | SWITZERLAND XCO/XCC - DHI

After hosting the 2018 UCI Mountain Bike World Championships presented by Mercedes-Benz and several rounds of the UCI World Cup, the Swiss alpine resort returns to the UCI World Cup with a double event. XCO and DHI specialists are looking forward to returning to Lenzerheide, which has always produced exciting XCO contests and thrilling DHI racing featuring high-speed passages and spectacular jumps.

SNOWSHOE USA

Sitting at 1500m, Snowshoe Mountain in West Virginia, USA, is a back on the UCI World Cup calendar after successfully hosting the UCI World Cup Finals in 2019. Snowshoe has been hosting mountain bike events for 20 years, including the US National Championships in 2017 and 2018. DHI mountain biking at Snowshoe is known for rocks and roots, and features a mixture of steep, fast, technical and flowing sections. The XCO course starts with a sprint through the village before heading into the scenic forest area with single tracks, rock gardens, root sections and fast descents.
