Welcome to Scotland and welcome to the 2023 UCI Gran Fondo World Championships!

For the first time ever the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships will be part of a wider UCI Cycling World Championships, with a huge variety of events and disciplines attracting elite athletes from all over the world to compete for hundreds of Rainbow Jerseys all over Scotland.

And you are part of it! The biggest Cycling World Championships in history!

Either side of the Championships' opening weekend you'll be one of thousands of amateur cyclists competing for age group world titles. On Friday 4 August, the road racers will gather in Perth for the Gran Fondo and Medio Fondo. Then, on Monday 7 it's the turn of the time trialists, who will tackle a tough, out-and-back route in Dundee.

Both Fondos will head into the foothills of the Scottish Highlands, providing riders with a tough challenge on the two routes. In contrast the time trial is a traditional British test, out and back along what is likely to be a windswept main road.

While you're here in Scotland there's plenty to do, especially with the other Cycling World Championships events taking place all over the country. The action begins on 4 August and goes all the way through to the 13, the Elite Women's Road Race concluding the world's biggest cycling event in Glasgow.

But Scotland is about more than just cycling, there's history, food, culture and some of Europe's most beautiful scenery.

The 2023 UCI Cycling World Championships will be set against the backdrop of some of Scotland's most iconic and spectacular cities and locations. Hosted everywhere from metropolitan Glasgow to the Highlands of Fort William, the Championships is proudly a pan-Scotland event. The power of the bike will take a global audience on a breath-taking tour, visiting landmarks rich with history like Stirling and Edinburgh Castle, to jaw dropping landscapes at Nevis Range and Loch Lomond.

Scotland has earned a world-renowned reputation for its major event hosting over the past decade, bringing The Ryder Cup, Commonwealth Games in 2014, World Gymnastics Championships 2015, European Championships 2018, and UEFA EURO 2020.

Scotland is getting ready; our volunteers are getting ready, and our warmest welcome will meet you in Scotland for this inspiring and innovative event. We cannot wait to see you in 2023!







TRAVEL BY TRAIN



Perth is served by good rail links with connections through Edinburgh and Glasgow that provide services around Scotland and the UK. Please note trains in Scotland have extremely limited capacity to carry bikes and must be booked in advance. Even with a booking space for your bike is not guaranteed, therefore we recommend you do not plan to travel to the Gran Fondo by train with your bike.

SHUTTLE BUS (4 AUGUST ONLY)

A shuttle bus will operate between Scone Palace and Perth on event day. This service is meant for spectators, supporters and other non-cycling entourage (no bikes will be transported on the bus). Perth is a short 10-minute bike ride from Scone Palace. Shuttle bus transfers will take approx. 10 minutes. See Event Maps for shuttle bus stop locations.

OFFICIAL EVENT CAR PARKING

The official event car parking is open on race day (4 August 2023) only and is located at:

Scone Palace, Perth, PH2 6BD

Participants should make use of the official event car parking. This is situated on the edge of Perth at the Finish Village. From the car parking it is a short 10-minute ride (or 30-minute walk) to the Start Pens on Tay Street in Perth.

Due to road closures and impacts on the race route the car park will have restricted arrival and departure times. Please ensure you arrive in good time and plan for extended waiting times as departures from the car parking will only be allowed once the sweep car arrives at the Finish (expected at 17:45). Timings subject to change on the day.

LICENCES

Riders with an elite licence can participate except for:

- Any rider who has during the current year been a member of a UCI registered team.
- Any rider who has taken part in a World Championships, the Olympic Games, Continental Games, Regional Games, the Commonwealth Games, or a World Cup during the current year.
- Any rider who has scored UCI points in the year of the World Championships.

Riders with a masters', amateur or cycling for all licence must have a UCI ID (11 digits code starting with 100xxxxxxxx or 101xxxxxxxx) and make sure that their respective national federation have uploaded their UCI ID to the UCI Dataride system so we can validate your licence online. Riders should also bring a proof of their licence (physical licence, printed form, online proof) showing their UCI ID.

Participation with a day licence or a licence of a federation not affiliated to the UCI is not possible.

JERSEYS

All riders must wear a jersey representing their nationality. This is preferably the official national kit from your national federation, but you are also entitled to have your own custom jersey designed if it respects the colours and layout of the original. Private / club sponsors are allowed. This rule also applies for the time trial.

Riders must always wear the jersey of their nationality but can race with a race license of the country of their residence.

BIKES

All bikes must conform to UCI regulations. There will be checks in the start boxes and bikes will also be checked for their weight (minimum 6.8kg without bottles and computer) after the finish line.



BEWARE OF THE POTENTIAL FOR BIKE THEFT IN THE AREA

Do not leave your bike unattended and unlocked at any time. There is no secure bike storage provision at the event.





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RIDER PACKS

Your rider pack contains all the essential items for your race. Please ensure you take time to go through it all before your ride.

Your Rider Pack is available for collection in the REGISTRATION area at Perth Concert Hall. You will need to collect it ahead of your ride.

Your Rider Pack contains the following:

- Coloured jersey number
- Coloured number stickers
- Timing Chip (see separate section)

YOUR BIB NUMBER

Please pin your bib number to the back of your jersey. This number must be clearly visible throughout your entire race. Safety pins will be available at Registration.



It is essential that you fill out the emergency and medical details on the back of your jersey number. In the event of an emergency, we will use this information to assist you.

COLOURED NUMBER STICKERS

You will find two stickers in your Rider Pack. Both must be used as instructed.

Seat Post: The long sticker is for your seat post. It is there to ensure that if your bike is misplaced and found we can return it. This MUST be attached to your bike for the duration of the race.

Helmet: The small sticker should be placed on the front of your helmet. This helps race officials identify you during the race and will also ensure you find all the great pictures of your ride from our official photography partners at Sportograf.



TIMING CHIPS

All riders will need to attach a timing chip to their bike. Details of how and where to mount will be provided upon collection.

Timing chips must be picked up during registration hours from the dedicated desk in the Perth Concert Hall and returned at the Timing Chip return tent at Scone Palace.



TRANSPONDER DEPOSIT

All riders will be required to give a deposit of £25 by credit card (or £35 by debit card) which will be credited back when the transponder is returned. No cash payments accepted.

QUALIFICATION & ONLINE ENTRIES

ONLINE ENTRIES FOR QUALIFIERS

All riders who have qualified in one of the UCI Gran Fondo World Series qualifier events will receive a direct email with a link to register.

Riders who think they qualified but didn't get their invitation email should check their spam folder and get in touch with info@ucigranfondoworldseries.com.

Registration deadline is 30 July 2023 at 23:59 GMT+1. It's not possible to register on the day.

REGISTRATION FEES

Road Race (Gran Fondo & Medio Fondo) entries are available for £90 (plus a £3.50 admin fee). Time Trial entries are available for £75 (plus a £3.50 admin fee).

OTHER METHODS FOR QUALIFICATION

- ✓ Defending world champions are qualified direct for both disciplines.
- ✓ Reigning national and continental masters' champions are qualified directly for both disciplines.
- ✓ Every country not hosting a qualifier event receives 10 wildcards (5 for men and 5 for women) which can be used for both disciplines or for one of both. These wildcards are to be allocated by the respective national federations.
- √ The national federation of the home country has 20 wildcards which can be used for both





START TIMES & START PENS

Start pens for all age groups are located on Tay Street (between Smeaton's Bridge and Queen's Bridge).

Riders will be penned in their individual age and gender groups. Please pay attention to signage and marshal instructions on the day of the event.

START TIMES

All races are mass-start with riders sub-divided into pens. Riders must start in the correct pen for their age and gender category. Starting your event from the wrong start pen is strictly prohibited and will result in disqualification. Start times are subject to change.

STARTING PROCEDURES

Defending World Champions and winners of the respective age groups of the different UCI Gran Fondo World Series qualifier events get first row access. They must line up in front of the rest of the peloton in the 5 minutes between their start and the previous start. Relevant riders should report to the front of the start pens (next to the Start Gantry – on the side closest to the Tay river). This start pen will be labelled as "RIDER CALL-UP AREA". Rider must report to the check-in staff at least 10 minutes before their age group start time.

All other riders must line up in the different start boxes with entry being from the back of the start pen on a first come, first serve basis. Panels will be placed at the entry of the pens to indicate the colours of the race numbers and age categories and marshals will control entry. Riders starting in the wrong pen will be disqualified.

CLASSIFICATIONS

Each age category has a different colour of race numbers. The colours are to indicate to riders who they are competing against during the race. Men and Women of the same age category have the same colours of race number.



























TIMING & RESULTS

All timing and results are determined by electronic timing using a timing chip attached to your bike. Please do not remove or damage your timing chip. If damaged you may not receive a finishing time (thus marked as DNF in the results).

TIMING FORMAT

All riders in the same start wave will receive the same "time of day" (Gun time) start time. Gun time is your time from when the start gun/horn goes off until you cross the finish line. All results in your age group and for purposes of determining the overall ranking are determined by your gun time. The three fastest riders across the finish line in each category will be invited to the podium presentations and medal ceremonies.

RESULTS

Live results including interval times at various checkpoints along the route will be available on the event day.



BAG DROP

A bag drop will be available to all registered riders on event day. Bag drop off will be located at Perth Concert Hall (near the Start Pens) and bags can then be collected from the Scone Palace (Finish Village). This service is free of charge. Random bag checks may be carried out for security reasons. Please do not leave valuables in your bag. Suitcases and large bags will not be accepted. 


MEDIO FONDO

FEED ZONE LITTERING

Taking food and drinks from a helper or the organisation is only possible in the designated feed zones. Also throwing away drinking bottles or gels/bars is only allowed in these zones (clearly indicated with a sign indicating the start and end of these zones).

We cannot emphasize enough that the correct use of these feed zones & littering zones is important. Littering or taking bottles or food outside these zones means disqualification from the race.

OUTSIDE ASSISTANCE


Volunteers won't be handing out drinking bottles nor have plastic bottles to grab. Riders will need to fill their bottles from large water bowsers and grab food/nutrition themselves.

A helper/relative may however hand out a bottle/drink in the dedicated zones. Any rider support (i.e. bottles, food, mechanical, etc.) is only allowed in the Feed Zones and nowhere else on course.

TOILETS

There will be a dedicated toilet zone on the Gran Fondo route. Location will be announced at the Rider Briefing. There are no toilets available at the Feed Zones.

MEDAL CEREMONIES

Medal ceremonies will take place for each age and gender group.

UCI regulations state all riders finishing in the top three of their age group must attend the podium presentation.

Cycling kit must be worn on the podium. Cycling shoes or suitable sports shoes are permitted. No hats, caps, sunglasses, open shoes.

You must arrive and check-in at the PODIUM WAITING AREA next to the main stage a minimum of 15 minutes before the indicated start time for your medal ceremony. Failure to do so will mean you can not appear on the podium.

HOST LOCATIONS

SCONE PALACE

If there's any place in the Perth area you would want a race finish it is Scone Palace, one of the most historic locations in the whole of Scotland.

And to celebrate the World Championships' visit the Palace are offering 20% off for riders, their friends and families between July 24th and August 6th inclusive. All you need to do is enter UCl2023 when purchasing your tickets at www.scone-palace.co.uk/plan-your-visit.

And if you like watching horse racing there'll be discounted tickets for their August 1st meeting. More details to follow via email for registered riders.

The current Scone Palace was built in 1803 but the site has been significant for 2,000 years or more, when Roman invaders camped at what was to be the northern most point of their empire.

In 906 King Constantine held the first ever recorded council on the site, which was by then home to the Stone of Destiny, used at the recent coronation of King Charles III. Scone subsequently became the seat of the Scottish Monarchs until the late 1400s.

Just over a century later Scone was handed to the Earls of Mansfield and the house remains with the Murray family to this day and the house is a focal point for events, hosting everything from music festivals to dog shows.



PERTH & KINROSS



Scotland's ancient capital for five centuries, the 'Fair City' of Perth. Bustling, compact and beautifully situated on the banks of the River Tay in the east of Scotland, this city is a sparkling cosmopolitan gem that keeps on giving visit after visit.



RULES & REGULATIONS

DRAFTING

Riders start in different waves with intervals, but groups can quickly catch each other and merge. You may join and ride normally with a group passing yours.

However, you are not permitted to wait or drop from one group to another which started after yours in order to pace another rider. This will result in disqualification.

BROOM WAGON / REAR CAR

A broom wagon will drive the full routes (the exact pace will be communicated in the rider briefing). If a rider is passed by the broom wagon this indicates their position is too far behind. They can continue to ride towards the finish but must respect road traffic regulations from that moment as they will be on open roads. If they cross the finish line before 17:45, they will still be ranked. Riders arriving after this time will not be able to ride through the finish line and will be directed back to the Event Village.

UCI GRAN FONDO WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS REGULATIONS

The UCI Gran Fondo World Series is a 'cycling for all' series where cyclists from all over the world can participate in events where they can obtain their ticket for the official UCI Gran Fondo World Championships in different age groups. There are qualifier events for both road-races and time-trial. The UCI Gran Fondo World Championships will crown the new UCI World Champions in Road racing and Time-trial.

1. PARTICIPATION RIGHTS

Riders taking part in the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships must hold a valid licence issued by their respective national federation (day licences being excluded), must hold a UCI ID (from 2020 onwards) and must be adequately insured against accidents and civil responsibility in the country in which the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships are held.

QUALIFICATION

Each UCI Gran Fondo World Series event grants qualification rights for the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships. Based on the results of each race, the first 25% of athletes in each age group will be qualified for the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships. The 25% is calculated based on the number of starters in each age group, and not on the number of riders having finished the race.



In addition, the first three riders of each official age category will qualify directly for the UCI World Championships, independently of the number of starters in that age group. Riders must finish the race to gain qualification.

As qualification for the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships starts as of September in the preceding calendar year, any riders who qualify before January 1st and who change age groups during the year of the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships will qualify as per their age group during the year of the qualifier event, but will be registered in their new age category for the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships.

At the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships, medals and titles will be awarded for men and/or women as soon as 1 rider is registered in the respective 5-year age category.

Qualification for the individual time trial and road race is determined as follows:

- Qualifier events of the UCI Gran Fondo World Series hosting only a road race will grant qualification for both the road race and time trial at the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships.
- Qualifier events of the UCI Gran Fondo World Series hosting a time trial and a road race will grant qualification for each respective event at the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships i.e. time trial or road race.
- Qualifier events of the UCI Gran Fondo World Series only hosting a time trial will grant qualification for the time trial only at the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships.

The names of riders having gained qualification through the UCI Gran Fondo World Series will be communicated on the UCI Gran Fondo World Series website www.ucigranfondoworldseries.com and will receive an official email from the UCI inviting them to register for the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships via the dedicated online registration portal.

WILDCARD

- There are different types of wildcards which allow riders to participate directly in the World Championships without qualification:
- The outgoing UCI World Champions in the time trial and road race may take part in the first UCI Gran Fondo World Championships following their title, in both the time trial and road race.
- All Masters national champions from the current year (in road race and individual time trial only) may enter the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships without qualification via the UCI Gran Fondo World Series. The Masters national champions in road race and time trial are confirmed to the UCI by the respective National Federation.
- The National Federation of the country of the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships may award an additional 20 wildcards (to 10 women and 10 men), which allow athletes to participate in both the time trial and road race. These wildcards are confirmed to the UCI by the respective National Federation.
- Each UCI Gran Fondo World Series qualifier events may grant 5 wildcards to riders who participated in their respective qualification event. These wildcards are confirmed to the UCI by each UCI Gran Fondo World Series organiser.
- All countries not hosting a UCI Gran Fondo World Series qualifier event may grant 10 wildcards (5 men / 5 women) to riders of their choice. These wildcards are confirmed to the UCI by the respective National Federation.



AGE GROUP

The age categories of the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships are:

- 19-34
- 35-39
- 40-44
- 45-49
- 50-54
- 55-59
- 60-64
- 65-69
- 70-74
- 75-79
- Etc...

Age groups applicable to the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships are defined by the rider's age on December 31st of the year of the World Championships.

2. THE COURSE

FEED ZONE

The local organiser must provide a feed zone where participants have access to drinks and food.

All feed zones must have:

- Beverages: water, isotonic drinks and, if the temperature is low, a hot drink
- Food: fruits, cereal bars, a food item with high nutritional content
- A sufficient number of mobile toilets must be provided.

For time trial:

• A beverage per rider is given at the finish.

BIKES

In the World Championships, all bikes will be checked for compliance with the UCI's regulations. For more information see the <u>bike specifications document</u>

Summary of the bike regulations:

- The minimum weight of the bike shall be 6.8 kilograms (without bottles and computers)
- The peak of the saddle shall be a minimum of 5 cm to the rear of a vertical plane passing through the bottom bracket spindle. For morphological reasons, the rider may request to place the peak of his saddle up to 0cm from the bottom bracket axle.
- For time trials, a fixed extension may be added to the steering system; in this instance, the height difference between the elbow support points and the highest and lowest points of the



handlebar extension (including gear levers in the most vertical position) must be less than 10 cm.

- The distance between the vertical line passing through the bottom bracket axle and the
 extremity of the handlebar extensions may not exceed 75 cm. For morphological reasons, the
 rider may request to place the extensions up to 80cm from the bottom bracket axle. In any
 case, the rider must choose between positioning the saddle to 0cm, or place the extensions
 up to 80cm, because only one morphological exception is granted.
- For a rider who is 190cm tall or taller, it is possible to place the extensions up to 85cm. In that case, it is necessary to present itself to the Commissaires' Panel sufficiently in advance before the start of the race, in order that the commissaires proceed to a verification of the size of the rider.

JERSEYS

It is mandatory for a rider to wear their national kit at the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships Time Trial and Road Race. Although the official national jersey is not required, a jersey representing their country with a similar design and colors as the original national team jersey is required. Private or club sponsors are allowed to be featured on the national jersey.

BACK NUMBER AND NUMBER PLATE

Race number must be attached to the back of the jersey (on the lower part of the back for better visibility). Each age group will receive a different coloured race number.

Number plates can also be produced by the organised but are not mandatory.

MECHANICAL ASSISTANCE

Mechanical assistance is provided on all the routes. At least 1 vehicles and/or motorcycles for service purposes are available to the cyclists per 2 start groups. Private cars with spare parts/bikes/wheels are forbidden in the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships

Riders are advised to bring their own spare tire or tubular to the race due to the difficulty of serving all concerned riders in UCI Gran Fondo World Championships with neutral support. The neutral support cars will start in front of the peloton and will only serve the break once the commissar in charge decides that it's safe to go behind the break.

TIMEKEEPING AND RANKING

The event must be timed for all the participants, for the entire length of the course. The timing of the event must start with the gun, and not when each individual rider crosses the starting carpet (GUN time principle).

SIGNAGE

All signage on the World Championships course will be marked at least the Tuesday before the event so that riders can train on the course.



3. THE START AND FINISH AREA

START BOXES AND START GRID

All riders will be placed in boxes per age category with the younger riders in front and the older in the back. Winners of the different qualifier events in their age group get first row access and will be called to the start line from the sideboard of the starting grid.

4. AWARDS CEREMONY

CEREMONY FOR WOMEN AND MEN

The three first riders of every age category (women and men) will be called to the podium to be awarded prizes and receive the medals and the new rainbow jersey for the new World Champion. During an official UCI Gran Fondo World Championships podium ceremony, riders are obliged to wear a cycling outfit (cycling shirt + bib), without hat, caps, glasses. It's also forbidden to wear open shoes or to put publicity on the world champion jersey during the ceremony.

SCHEDULING

A rigorous schedule and presentation will be arranged to inform riders.

5. SAFETY REGULATIONS

PARTICIPANTS

- Mandatory helmet: The UCI takes a very hard line on the wearing of a helmet. Wearing a
 helmet will be compulsory during the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships, throughout the
 whole race. Participants are barred from the start or their race number will be immediately
 withdrawn if they are caught by a member of the organisation without their helmet.
- Medical certificate: To confirm the physical capability of a cyclist to take part in the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships, the organiser requires a medical certificate for all participants to take part in the race, next to a national year license from a UCI affiliated cycling federation.
- Each rider is responsible for ensuring that sufficient insurance has been taken out for eventual
 accidents which may occur during the race. This can be ensured either through an individual
 race license covering races abroad or through a private insurance policy. Neither the UCI nor
 the local organiser of the qualifier event must take out insurance for in-race accidents and
 crashes.

SAFETY ON THE COURSE

- Safety plan: The organiser prepares a full safety plan.
- Identification of danger points: The organiser takes care to indicate all the danger points.



- Following vehicles: For sporting fairness and to avoid possible problems, riders will be eliminated immediately if they are caught benefiting from vehicular assistance from a third party not belonging to the organisation.
- For road race events, full road closures are advised but not mandatory. For a Time Trial event, full road closures are mandatory.

FIRST AID

Emergency system:

At least 2 ambulances are available for an event of up to 4'000 participants with 1 further ambulance for each 4'000 additional participants. To facilitate the arrival of assistance in an accident, 2 ambulances will be positioned as follows: 1 ambulance follows the big pack or peloton and 1 ambulance follows the last participant as the broom wagon. Additional ambulances will be positioned by the organiser depending on requirements.

- The organiser provides a first aid kit to provide minor assistance to cyclists at the start, finish and at all feed zones.
- Information on the reverse side of the race numbers: Cycling is unfortunately not a risk-free sport. To deal as effectively as possible with accidents which may affect a participant during the event, and to facilitate the work of the doctors as far as possible, the organiser produces race numbers which will include on the reverse side a form to be completed. The minimum information required by the UCI, which shall be written on the reverse side of the race numbers, is as follows:
- Last name and first name Blood group Present physical condition (asthma, diabetes, allergy(ies), epilepsy, etc.) Any current medication Last name, first name and telephone number (with national dialing code) of the emergency contact.
