

The Para cycling roadmap contains an overview of the documents relating to the Para cycling road competition at the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games and provides a variety of other information designed to help teams with their planning and preparation for the Games.

All of the information contained in this Para cycling road guide was correct at the time of publication, but some details may change prior to the Games. NPC representatives are therefore invited to regularly consult the information published by Paris 2024 for the latest updates or to contact their Paris 2024 sport manager.

This Para cycling roadmap has been designed as an internal operational manual for the Paris 2024 stakeholders and must not be shared publicly.

The Para cycling road event will cover four full days of intense competition and allow spectators to get up and close to the action!

We cannot wait to welcome you to the City of Light in summer 2024 for what will be an unforgettable edition of the Games.


Patients whose state of health may be life threatening in one of the venue zones will be taken to the nearest hospital.









COMPETITION RULES

EVENTS

The road cycling competition at the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games will be held from Wednesday 4 September to Saturday 7 September 2024. The start and finish for the individual time trial, road race and mixed team relay events will be in Clichy-sous-Bois (Seine-Saint-Denis).





COMPETITION FORMAT

The Para cycling road competition consists of three (3) types of events:

- **The individual time trial**, with staggered rider starts every minute (1 min). The fastest rider in each event is declared the winner. The course covers 14.1km.
- **The road race** is a mass start event. The first rider across the finish line in each event is declared the winner. The course covers 14.2km.
- **The mixed team relay** is an event in which the first riders in each team start together, then passes the relay to the next rider, and so on, on each lap in a designated relay area. The first athlete across the finish line wins the race for their team. The course covers 1.8km.

Events are assigned the following classification codes:

- **‘B’ for tandems,**
- **‘H’ for handcycles,**
- **‘C’ for cycles,**
- **‘T’ for tricycles.**

Riders’ confirmation and team leaders’ meetings will take place on Tuesday 3 September in the team area of Henri Barbusse sports complex in Clichy-sous-Bois (further information on pre-competition procedures below).

RULES

The Para cycling road competition will be held in accordance with the editions of the following documents that are in force at the time of the Games:

In accordance with the “Paralympic Games” chapter of the IPC Handbook, UCI will be responsible for the control and direction of the Para cycling road competitions at the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games.

CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT

NPC RACE VEHICLES AND TECHNICAL VEHICLES

Vehicles - Toyota Corolla Touring Sports, hybrid - with category C 7-bike roof rack (Thule brand) and radios will be supplied to NPCs with athletes participating in the road cycling events, in addition to the number of vehicles allocated to NPCs depending on delegation size.

Vehicles will be driven by a member of the NPC with a UCI licence during the events (Paris 2024 will not provide NPCs with drivers). Vehicles and keys will be managed by the respective NPCs. As part of the Paris 2024 official fleet, vehicles will be supplied with a multi-functional map paid by the OCOG, insurance and VAPP (P3 CYC non-transferable).

TECHNICAL VEHICLES

Paris 2024 will provide NPCs with a parking zone from 2 September to the evening of 7 September for NPC technical vehicles: Sodexo car park, Avenue Émile Zola. Additional parking for these technical vehicles will be reserved at Armand Desmet gymnasium located 1.5km from Henri Barbusse sports complex. A shuttle service will be available to NPCs parked at Armand Desmet gymnasium.

Technical vehicles are limited to 9m³ (5.04m in length, 2.47m in width, 2.30m in height) at these car parks.

These technical vehicles will remain parked from 2 to 7 September in the same spot. NPC personnel will have access to these car parks, but technical vehicles may not leave the perimeter until the evening of 7 September.

RACE CONVEY VEHICLES

On familiarisation day, 3 September, Toyota NPC vehicles with roof rack will park at Place du Marché car park.

Before travelling to the Clichy-sous-Bois venue, NPC vehicles must go through a security checkpoint located at the La Courneuve - Parc Georges-Valbon venue, Tapis Vert car park, 55 avenue Waldeck Rochet 93120 La Courneuve - where their vehicle will be inspected and sealed. Vehicles must not be opened between this checkpoint and their arrival at the Clichy-sous-Bois venue so as not to damage the seals. The access route to the Clichy-sous-Bois venue will be indicated to nations by Paris 2024, see chapter **Transport and Facilities**.

To enter the Clichy-sous-Bois competition venue, NPC vehicles must be equipped with a VAPP (Vehicle Access and/or Parking Permit) which will be checked in the VSA (Vehicle Screening Area). Cars will be inspected by duly authorised security personnel.

On the evening of the familiarisation day, NPC Toyota vehicles will remain parked at Place du Marché car park. This car park will be guarded by the Paris 2024 team. NPC assistants will travel to the Paralympic Village via a Paris 2024 shuttle service. This shuttle service will bring them back to the Clichy-sous-Bois competition venue on 4



September for the time trial. After the time trial, all NPC following vehicles must leave Place du Marché where they will no longer be authorised to park.

On the road race days, from 4 September, NPC Toyota vehicles with roof rack will no longer be authorised at the Clichy-sous-Bois competition venue. All NPC personnel will travel to Clichy-sous-Bois via the shuttle service operated by Paris 2024.

STARTING INTERVAL FOR INDIVIDUAL TIME TRIALS

The starting order for each event will be determined by UCI on the day of the team leaders' meeting, scheduled for 3 September at 18:00.

Riders will set off at an interval of one (1) minute.

Each rider will be preceded by a police motorbike and followed by a car driven by a representative of their NPC. Each following vehicle will display the name of the athlete on the front of the car.

SHIMANO NEUTRAL ASSISTANCE SERVICE

A Shimano neutral assistance service will be available to athletes on the familiarisation day and competition days, in accordance with UCI Regulations. This service will also be available in the athletes' area at the venue. The neutral assistance service will be provided by four Shimano cars on familiarisation and competition days and by a team at the start venue in Clichy-sous-Bois.

WHEELCHAIR, PROSTHETICS & ORTHOTICS REPAIR SERVICE

The Ottobock wheelchair, prosthetics and orthotics repair service will provide a range of services adapted to the mobility equipment used by competing athletes: wheelchair, prosthetics & orthotics repair station.

The repair station will be located near the team tents and will be operational from 3 September to 7 September 2024.

These services will be available from one hour before the start of competition and up until the end of competition.

More complex repairs will be referred to the main repair centre in the Paralympic Village.

FEED ZONES

Two feed zones will be located on the course for all Para cycling events. Athlete feeding will be on both sides of the road:

- **First feed zone:** Km 0.3: Avenue Jean Moulin
- **Second feed zone:** Km 6.8: at the junction of Route Villeparisis/Route Stratégique located at the top of the Côte de Courtry

To limit the number of persons in the feed zones, two accreditations will be issued to teams at the riders' confirmation.

Each feed zone will be preceded and followed by a signposted waste zone.

The first feed zone will not be in operation on the first lap, and the second feed zone will not be in operation on riders' last lap.

Team assistants will travel to the first feed zone on foot. This zone is located 300m from Place du Marché car park.

Paris 2024 will provide team assistants with a shuttle fleet from the start venue to the second feed zone in Courtry at Km 6.8. NPCs will have a maximum of 2 representatives authorised per feed zone.

Once athletes have passed through the zone, team assistants will be taken by Paris 2024 shuttle service to the start/finish zone during the intersession.

These feed zones are closed and secured by the organisers.

Each zone will be equipped with toilets for team members, team tents and signs marking the entrance and end of the zone.



WASTE ZONES

Paris 2024 will provide waste zones to collect litter throughout the women’s and men’s courses.

Riders may not throw litter, bottles or any other objects outside of these zones marked by “start” and “end” signs.

Riders and followers must exercise responsibility in relation to the environment in all circumstances.

VICTORY CEREMONIES

The victory ceremony zone at Clichy-sous-Bois will be located in a dedicated area. All medallists will have access to this area with their specific Paris 2024 volunteers.

A special area will be provided for all medallists while awaiting the ceremony.

Athletes will receive a ceremony schedule for each day and each discipline for each competition day. Please refer to the competition schedule below.

The protocol for each medallist includes the victory ceremony.

The first three riders (i.e. 9 athletes for the mixed team relay) in each event by class must attend the victory ceremony. Athletes must wear their NPC uniform.

Both the tandem pilot and the rider will receive medals.



PENALTIES


The UCI table of race incidents alone shall apply to the Paris 2024 Para cycling road events.

DOPING CONTROLS

The anti-doping programme for the Olympic and Paralympic Games is put in place by Paris 2024 under the responsibility of the International Testing Agency (ITA), to which the International Olympic Committee (IOC) has delegated certain responsibilities, and the International Paralympic Committee (IPC).

This programme complies with the International Olympic Committee (IOC ADR) and IPC anti-doping rules and the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) Code. These rules are accompanied by the prohibited list, athlete whereabouts requirements and therapeutic use exemptions (TUEs).

Training for the cycling road competition (individual time trial and road race) will take place at the Polygone venue in the Bois de Vincennes, in Paris' 12th arrondissement.

The cycling ring covers a distance of 3.13km, with top-quality asphalt surfacing.

The circuit is entirely flat and does not present any difficulties.

POLYGONE DE VINCENNES CYCLING RING TRAINING COURSE

Training will be open to athletes from 10:30 to 13:30 as of 22 August until 2 September and on 5 and 6 September.

There will be no training on the afternoon of the Opening Ceremony, on Wednesday 28 July. The training venue will be open from 10:30 to 12:00 on this day.

The facilities and changing rooms at the Polygone flat course are reserved for athletes during the slots booked.

Located 17km from the Paralympic Village (40 mins), the venue will be serviced by Paris 2024 shuttle buses for athletes accommodated at the Paralympic Village and their staff. Their bikes and equipment will be transported by Paris 2024 logistics resources.

Parking spaces are also available at the training venue for NPCs wishing to arrive with their NPC technical vehicle.

TRAINING SESSIONS

The time slot pre-booking/amendment system for training sessions will be available from the Sport Information Centre at the Paralympic Village or the Sport Information Desk located at the competition venue. Paris 2024 has also put in place a digital booking platform. Only athletes who have booked a training slot will be authorised to use the transport provided by Paris 2024.

The official familiarisation day on the Clichy-sous-Bois competition course will take place on 3 September 2024, the day before the first competition day. No training sessions are scheduled at the training venue on this day.

There will also be no training sessions on 4 September 2024. All athletes will be at Clichy-sous-Bois on this day.

TRAINING RULES

Training sessions will not be open to the media.

There is no specific time slot for each Para athlete category in the training area.

All riders may ride at their discretion during the daily opening hours.

The team leaders' meetings will be held in accordance with UCI Regulations in the presence of the UCI Technical Delegate, the President of the UCI Commissaires' Panel, the International and National Technical Officials, the Paris 2024 Para Cycling Sport Manager, the Paris 2024 Para Cycling Road Discipline Manager, and anti-doping officers.

All team leaders (2 representatives max. per NPC) are required to attend the meeting, which will provide critical information to athletes during competition, including information on regulations, venue operations, feed zone operations and protocols.

DISTRIBUTION OF RIDERS' NUMBERS AND TRANSPONDERS

For the time trial, each athlete will receive a race number and a timing transponder with a GPS tracking device, which must be used during the event.

For the road race, athletes will receive two race number bibs, a personalised timing transponder specific to the event, without a GPS tracking device, and a frame plate in the colour of the athlete's class.

Equipment and start lists will be distributed at the team leaders' meeting.

Transponders will be returned to Omega at the end of each athlete's last event.

INTERMEDIATE TIMING POINT

A timing point will be positioned on the time trial and road race courses:

→ Clichy-sous-Bois, Boulevard Émile Zola, level with the finish line

TIMING

For the time trial, each athlete will receive a timing transponder with a GPS tracking device, which must be used during the event.

For the road race, athletes will receive a personalised timing transponder specific to the event, without a GPS tracking device.

Both transponders will be collected after each athletes' last event directly behind the finish line. If a rider does not finish (DNF), the transponders must be directly handed to the official Omega timekeeper.

RADIO TOUR

Each car in the race convoy (Toyota Corolla TS with roof rack) will be fitted with a radio transmitter-receiver.

The frequency will be 170.1125 MHz



The start and finish locations and the team and organisation spaces will be identical for all Para cycling road events.

The competition venue is located 17km from the Paralympic Village.

Finishes will be judged at the far end of a 350m-long and 5m-wide finishing straight.





SERVICES PROVIDED

ATHLETES' LOUNGE

Paris 2024 will provide an athletes' lounge for each event. In Clichy-sous-Bois, this space will be located at the centre of the team and organisation area.

A refreshment station will serve cereal bars, fruit and drinks.

This space will contain TVs showing the live feed of the competition as well as footage of the ceremonies. The athletes' lounge will also have tables, chairs and sofas

and will be equipped with Wi-Fi access.

ICE AND WATER DISTRIBUTION

During the familiarisation day on 3 September, 1kg of ice will be provided to each athlete in the sport equipment distribution tent near the storage area. During each competition event (time trial, road race and mixed team relay), 2kg of ice will be provided to each athlete.

Bottled water can be collected at the sport equipment tent.

Sports drinks will be available in the athletes' lounge on familiarisation and competition days.

ATHLETES' AREA

Each team has a space in the gymnasium for team preparation, equipped with chairs, a bench, a table, a Wi-Fi connection, power sockets, a fan, and a bike stand. The spaces will be adapted to the size of the NPC delegation.

Each team will also have an equipment storage space outside the gymnasium, in the tent area. These spaces will be adapted to the size of the NPC delegation and will be locked and guarded on a 24-hour basis.

All NPCs will receive specific keys to unlock their respective spaces.

Additional outdoor areas will be provided at Henri-Barbusse sports complex for all athlete warm-ups and cool-downs for each event. These areas will be marked by barriers. Each area will have a sunshade. Athletes can cycle on the indoor tracks at Henri Barbusse sports complex, marked out by Paris 2024.

This additional space will not have 24-hour security.

TIME TRIAL AND ROAD RACE EVENTS:

An additional area marked by barriers will be available to delegations in the vicinity of the sports complex in addition to the dedicated gymnasium area. The size of these areas will be proportional to the number of athletes in each delegation.

HOME TRAINERS AND BIKE STANDS

A limited number of home trainers (30) (reference: Van Rysel Interactive Turbo Trainer D100) will be available for teams to use on loan if required. They are available in the equipment distribution area, near the team areas.

They may be used in two designated spaces: the team areas and the warm-up and cool-down area in the vicinity of the sports complex.

This equipment must be returned to the Organising Committee after use.





Paris 2024 provides NCPs with bike stands (90) in the team areas and in the warm-up and cool-down area of the sports complex. This equipment must be returned to the Organising Committee after use. NPC's will be charged for the amount of any equipment that is not returned or is returned in a damaged condition.

TOWELS

For the familiarisation day and the time trial, road race and mixed team relay events, each athlete will be provided with a P2024 towel per day.

MEDICAL SERVICES

The athletes' medical station will be located near the team tents. The Paralympic Games Paris 2024 athlete medical team will provide services such as first aid, emergency care, sports medicine and physiotherapy services to athletes, team officials and technical officials.

An ambulance will be present during medical services operating hours and staffed with a crew of trained medical personnel.

A medical service will also be in place during races.

TEAM ASSISTANTS AREAS - BEHIND THE FINISH LINE

For each event, a team assistants area is reserved behind the finish line to receive athletes and hand out water, towels and bottles. Team assistants must have their accreditation on them in this area.

VICTORY CEREMONIES PREPARATION / WAITING AREA

Times are announced and displayed each day in the Athletes' Lounge.

Athletes will be escorted by volunteers to the ceremony location.

Medallist athletes must gather in the Athletes' Lounge.

ACCESS POINTS

Access control for team following vehicles for the familiarisation (03/09) and time trial (04/09).

Before travelling to the Clichy-sous-Bois venue from the Paralympic Village, NPC vehicles must go through a security checkpoint located at the La Courneuve, Parc Georges-Valbon venue, Tapis Vert car park, where their vehicle will be inspected and sealed.

- **Tuesday 3 September:** Remote VSA open from 4am to 9am, for familiarisation sessions starting at 9am.
- **Wednesday 4 September:** Remote VSA open from 3am to 8am, for competitions starting at 8am.

The route from La Courneuve to the Clichy-sous-Bois competition venue is precised to reach the Mandatory Passing Point (PPO). See map below.


PPO (MANDATORY PASSING POINT)

A smooth race start, for riders and followers alike, is dependent on the start operations. Access signage at the start venue, from all sources, is key to this success. This assembly area takes the form of the Mandatory Passing Point (PPO). Each entity will then be guided to their respective parking area (NPC, organisation) via suitable signage and/or personnel.

To enter the Clichy-sous-Bois competition venue, NPC vehicles must be equipped with a VAPP (Vehicle Access and/or Parking Permit) which will be checked in the VSA (Vehicle Screening Area). Cars will be inspected by duly authorised security personnel.

From the team car park at Place du Marché, NPC vehicles authorised on the FOP must have a second VAPP checked by the Paris 2024 organising team.

For NPC vehicles following several of their riders, a mandatory diversion will be in place at Allée Étienne Laurent to reach the team car park at Place du Marché. Direct access will be organised at the VSA at the entrance to Place du Marché.



BIKE TRANSPORT

The Paris 2024 team encourages NPCs to use their NPC Toyota vehicle with roof rack to transport their bikes from the Paralympic Village to the training and competition venues.

A logistics service for nations accommodated at the Paralympic Village will be provided to transport bikes and sport equipment to the training and competition venues for nations submitting a request.

BIKE STORAGE

The National Paralympic Committees will have a dedicated space to store their bikes and equipment in the team area of the Henri Barbusse sports complex at the competition venue. This space has been sized according to the athlete quota per nation. Nations may store their equipment and bikes in their respective areas on 29, 30 and 31 August and on 2 September, with the exception of 1 September (start of the lockdown period: securing of the competition venue).

In order to facilitate access to the Clichy-sous-Bois venue, NCS (National Committee Services) will supply a form to select: the day, the time slot and the type of vehicle to drop off equipment at the venue on 29, 30 and 31 August and 2 September.

The bike storage area will be guarded 24 hours a day and locked.

ATHLETE AND TECHNICAL OFFICIALS' TRANSPORT

Paris 2024 will organise transport for nations accommodated at the Paralympic Village.

Paris 2024 Paralympic Games buses will drop off athletes in the athlete load zone, located 300m southwest of the team and organisation areas. This specific loadzone is reserved for all athletes in wheelchairs for all Para cycling road events at Clichy-sous-Bois.

MIXED ZONE

There will be a mixed zone at the venue which will be in operation for all competitions. Athletes will pass through the mixed zone when they leave the course. This zone is located on the right-hand side of the path leading to the athlete areas.

BIKE CHECK

A bike check area is located near the athlete areas. Under the supervision and authority of UCI, athletes' bikes and equipment may be checked after each event. The UCI commissaires will notify athletes of any checks on their equipment.

VICTORY CEREMONIES

Victory ceremonies will be held in accordance with the scheduled published. Athletes will be escorted from their sport areas to the victory ceremony area by Paris 2024 volunteers.

Participants at the victory ceremony must not have flags, mascots, mobile phones, cameras, headphones, sport equipment or other objects on them during the ceremony; doing so is in breach of Rule 50. Athletes must wear their NPC uniform. Please also note that only athletes and members of the victory ceremony team (sport presentation) may participate in the victory ceremony.

RESULTS PUBLICATION

For all events (time trial/road races/mixed team relay), Paris 2024 will publish the results in accordance with UCI Regulations.


