After losing much of her own hair due to a scalp condition, Walker was inspired to create hair products specifically for Black women's needs. She invented the "Walker Method," a special combination of lotions, combs, and scalp creams.

Walker traveled all over the country selling her homemade products directly to Black communities. Her products were so successful that she founded the Madam C.J. Walker Manufacturing Company.
