

KEY DATES

Hotel quarantine workers (including staff transporting people between airports and hotels) must be fully vaccinated (after being required to have had 1 dose of a COVID-19 vaccine by 8 April).

Construction workers must have had 1 dose of a COVID-19 vaccine (relevant date: 30 September).

Commercial freight workers must have 1 dose of a COVID-19 vaccine.

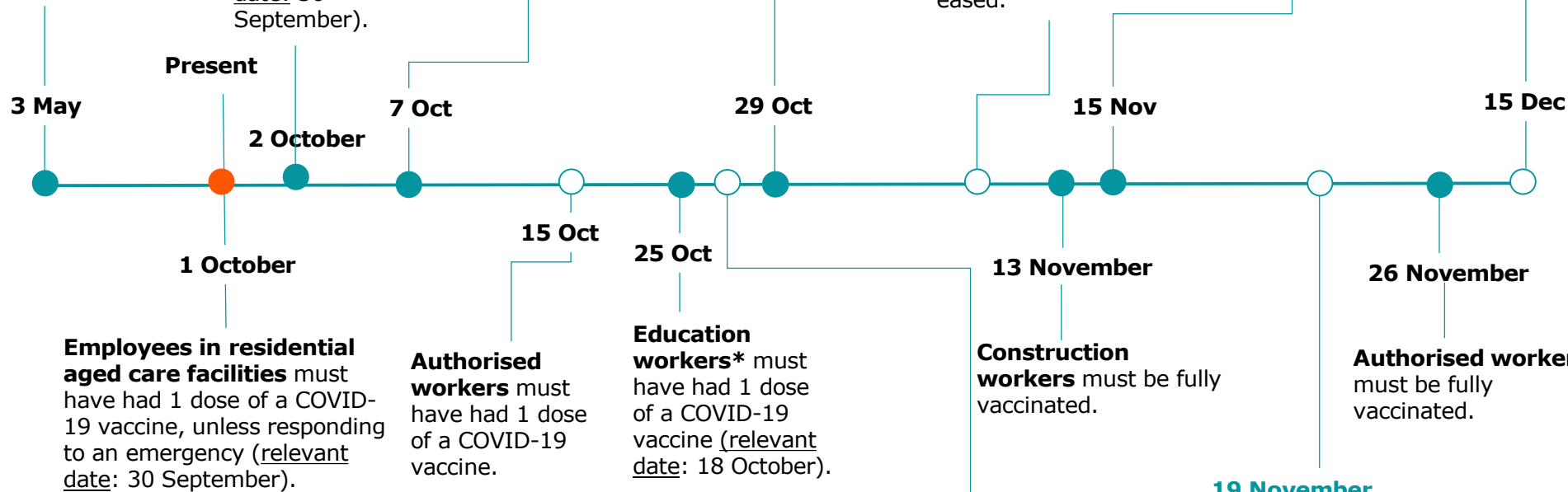
Healthcare workers* must have 1 dose of COVID-19 vaccine (relevant date: 15 October).

Employees in residential aged care facilities must be fully vaccinated.

Healthcare and education workers* must be fully vaccinated.

***Education workers** are persons who work in schools (including principals, teachers, administration and education support staff, casual relief teachers and pre-service teachers), or early childhood education and care (including outside school hours care services).

***Healthcare workers** are persons engaged by a healthcare operator to perform at a healthcare facility: healthcare services, administrative or ancillary roles, ambulance and patient transport services and work at a retail business operating within a healthcare facility. A healthcare facility is defined to mean (amongst other things): hospitals, community health centres and services, general practices, dental surgeries, health clinics, pharmacies, diagnostic and imaging centres, blood donation services etc.



Employees in residential aged care facilities must have had 1 dose of a COVID-19 vaccine, unless responding to an emergency (relevant date: 30 September).

Authorised workers must have had 1 dose of a COVID-19 vaccine.

Education workers* must have had 1 dose of a COVID-19 vaccine (relevant date: 18 October).

Construction workers must be fully vaccinated.

Authorised workers must be fully vaccinated.

26 October (anticipated): 70% Victorians over 16 y.o. fully vaccinated: certain restrictions eased, including removal of reasons to leave home and curfew, travel limit increased to 25 km.

19 November (anticipated): 80% Victorians over 12 y.o. fully vaccinated: restrictions eased in accordance with National Cabinet plan.

Relevant date means the date from which the operator of a facility must collect vaccination information about the worker, and prevent entry to premises of an unvaccinated worker (or worker who has not supplied their vaccination status) unless the worker holds a booking to receive their first dose vaccination before the first dose deadline and is required to wear personal protective equipment.

All deadlines are subject to exceptions for employees with **medical contraindications**.
