- 1 CASTRIES, ST LUCIA**
Castries offers access to all of the island's wonders, including its 2,000-foot-high Piton mountains, rejuvenating mud baths in Sulphur Springs, and an array of quiet, dreamy shores with dramatic backdrops.
- 2 CHARLOTTEVILLE, TOBAGO**
With its beautiful sandy shores, crystal-clear waters, and lush vegetation, this laidback oasis lures travellers seeking peace and tranquillity.
- 3 MARINA DAY, MUSTIQUE**
The favourite retreat of Princess Margaret, Mustique has been luring celebrities and aristocrats since the 1960s. It still sparkles over half a century later thanks to its undeveloped beaches and unrivalled privacy.
- 4 LE MARIN, MARTINIQUE**
Navigate to Le Marin, where Martinique's spirit is on display in vivid colours, lively bars, and world-class restaurants.
- 5 AT SEA, CARIBBEAN SEA**
Soak up the sunshine and the endless ocean views as you island hop across the calm waters of the Caribbean.
- 6 GUSTAVIA, ST BARTHS**
St Barths is one of the Caribbean's top yachting destinations, and laidback Gustavia is your gateway to its many wonders.
- 7 BEACH DAY, PRICKLY PEAR**
Escape to secluded Prickly Pear Island, where pristine shores, crystal-clear waters, and unhurried relaxation await.
- 8 ST JOHN'S, ANTIGUA**
Colourful houses line the streets, punctuated by thriving farmers markets, shops stocked with unique handicrafts, and historic sites like St John's Cathedral and Fort James.
