When someone is **displaced** from their home, it means they have to move for reasons outside of their control. Sometimes they are escaping war or violence, other times they must leave because of hunger, poverty, or natural disasters.

If someone is displaced from their home, they will need to be **resettled** in a new country. Sometimes they have to travel a long time to reach their new "home." Once they arrive, many things may be unfamiliar to them: they may not speak the same language, eat the same foods, and may have had different experiences with school and education.

It is important to remember that all people, including all refugees, want to exercise their **human rights**, such as the right to education, the right to free speech, and the right to be treated equally.
