Since 2014, global hunger has been on the rise. But the world produces enough food to feed everyone. Why does anyone have to go hungry when there is enough food?

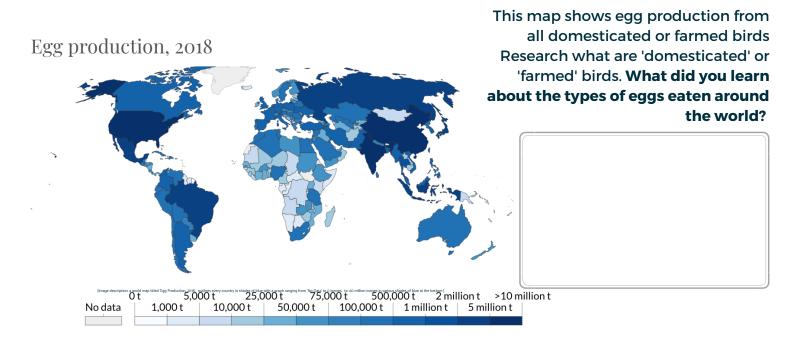
It all comes down to **food waste** and **food loss**. Food waste happens when we let food go bad or simply throw it out before eating it. Food loss is when crops go bad due to climate events like droughts and fires or bad refrigeration. If we make sure we don't waste food and if we take action to protect our planet by recycling and limiting the trash we produce, we can help make sure that no one goes hungry and everyone has enough food!
