

2024 PBR World Finals: Unleash The Beast Eliminations Fort Worth, Texas – Cowtown Coliseum Sunday, May 12 at 1:45 p.m. CDT

SWEARINGEN AND CRIMBER TIE FOR ROUND 3 VICTORY – 2022 PBR World Champion Daylon Swearingen roared out to an early lead, topping Hoka Hey for an incredible fourth time in four outs, scoring 89.25 points to move into first place in Round 3 Saturday evening. However, in the fourth-to-last out of the night, 18-year-old John Crimber matched the former champ, covering Brown Bomber for 89.25 points of his own. The clutch rides were the first at the 2024 World Finals for both cowboys, pushing Swearingen to No. 15 in the Unleash The Beast standings and allowing Crimber to retake the No. 2 spot after Eduardo Aparecido jumped him with his Round 1 victory. Swearingen faces off with Doze You Down in Round 4 on Sunday, while Crimber dances with Ugly This.

Swearingen wasn't the only former World Champion to make the 8 in Round 3, as Kaique Pacheco hung on to La Grande for 83.25 points. His first ride at this year's World Finals didn't move him up in the standings but secured his hold on the No. 14 spot, keeping him qualified for a place at AT&T Stadium next weekend. The Ice Man battles UTZ BesTex Smokestack for his final out this weekend.

ROOKIE KAIDEN LOUD REMAINS PERFECT – The only rider still perfect in Eliminations entering Round 4 on Sunday is rookie Kaiden Loud, who roared out of the chutes aboard Renegade for 88.5 points Saturday night. Moving up to No. 9 in the standings after the dust settled in front of a packed Cowtown Coliseum, Loud's flawless performance in Fort Worth, Texas, has catapulted the Texan eleven spots up the Unleash The Beast ladder.

A rider for the Nashville Stampede on the separate PBR Camping World Team Series, Loud began his first World Finals by riding Black Betty for 86.75 points to tie with No. 1 Cassio Dias for second in Round 1. Competing just over an hour from his hometown of Kaufman, Texas, Loud then covered Doze You Down for a career and event-high 91.75 points to win Round 2. He takes on Hunting Trip in Round 4 Sunday afternoon.

Dias, the only other rider to cover his first two animal athlete opponents, was finally bested by Norse God in 5.78 seconds but remained second in the event aggregate. Right behind him in the event standings is No. 11 Thiago Salgado. After bucking off Snap Chatter in 3.2 seconds in Round 1, the Brazilian has found his form, riding Jersey Mike for 83.5 points in Round 2 and Baldy for 87.5 points in Round 3. Salgado shares a chute with Flyin Wired in Round 4.

COOL WHIP TOPS HEARTBREAK KID, CLOSES IN ON BUSHWACKER – After dispatching Boudreaux Campbell in 1.58 seconds in Round 2, Cool Whip has now bucked off 41 consecutive riders on the premier series, leaving him just one buck off short of Bushwacker's historic 42-out run. That buck-off streak was the longest in premier series history, spanning from November 1, 2009, to August 16, 2013, and was ended by two-time PBR World Champion J.B. Mauney, who made the 8 for a monstrous 95.25 points in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Cool Whip's streak dates back to May 12, 2022, when he bucked off the soon-to-be-crowned World Champion Daylon Swearingen in 3.91 seconds. After finishing fourth in the 2023 PBR World Champion Bull race, the powerful animal athlete has bucked off all ten riders he has faced on the elite Unleash The Beast this season. Having only been topped once in 59 career outs (98.3 buck off percentage) by Joao Ricardo Vieira for 82.5 points in Tulsa, Oklahoma, in April of 2022, Cool Whip attempts to make history in Round 4 against Alex Cerqueira on Sunday.

- Bob Mitchell takes on Punchy Pete for the third time after bucking off the powerful bovine competitor in 3.22 seconds in Fort Worth, Texas, last October and in 7.09 seconds in Little Rock, Arkansas, in March.
- Brady Fielder tries to be the second cowboy to ride Man Hater this season after bucking off him in 5.75 seconds in Kansas City, Missouri, last August and in 4.63 seconds in Tulsa, Oklahoma, in January.
- Cody Jesus seeks his revenge against The Kraken who bucked him off in 6.5 seconds in Albuquerque, New Mexico, in March.
- Cort McFadden faces off with Manaba for the second time after being bested in 4.16 seconds in Salt Lake City, Utah, in February.
- Dawson Branton and Red Demon have unfinished business, as the bull bested the Oregonian in 5.84 seconds in Fort Worth, Texas, during last year's World Finals in May.
- Eduardo Aparecido duels Blown Away for the second time after losing the rope during the 7.71-second mark in Chicago, Illinois, in January of 2023.
- Ezekiel Mitchell takes on UTZ BesTex Legend for the third time after being unseated in 3.29 seconds in New Orleans, Louisiana, last March and in 2.47 seconds in Fort Worth, Texas, last October.
- John Crimber was bucked off by Ugly This in 5.76 seconds earlier this year in March in Little Rock, Arkansas.
- Kaique Pacheco looks to remain perfect aboard UTZ BesTex Smokestack after topping the animal athlete for 90.5 points in Duluth, Georgia, in January of 2023 and 90.75 points in Albuquerque, New Mexico, in March of this year.
- Koltin Hevalow dances with Mike's Magic once again after being bucked off in 5.71 seconds in Fort Worth, Texas, at least year's World Finals in May and in 3.69 seconds in Cheyenne, Wyoming, in July of 2023.
- Kyler Oliver shares a chute with Magic Potion after being bucked off in 3.02 seconds in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, in February of 2022.
- Vitor Losnake squares off with Bandito Bug for the second time this season after covering him for 83.5 points in Johnstown, Pennsylvania, in December of 2023.

BULL PEN – Tonight's draw will feature a rank pen, with the top contenders for this year's YETI World Champion Bull title set to take on the Top 45 riders in the world. The 2024 YETI PBR World Champion Bull will be the animal with the highest average bull score from his six highest-scored outs logged during the 2024 PBR Team Series and 2024 Unleash The Beast regular season, and two outs at the 2024 PBR World Finals. The top bucking bulls competing at the World Finals will receive three outs, and World Champion contenders will be able to drop their lowest score at the event.

The 2024 YETI PBR World Champion Bull race has been dominated by Man Hater, who squared off with No. 14 Julio Cesar Marques in Round 2 Friday evening. Spanning back to the 2023 PBR Camping World Team Series season, the powerful bovine competitor had bucked off all 15 of his cowboy opponents until Cassio Dias covered him for a season-high 94.75 points in the championship round in Los Angeles to take the event title. The elite animal athlete sought his revenge in Albuquerque, New Mexico, but Dias once again made the 8, this time for a monstrous 93.25 points. Heading into Sunday against Brady Fielder, Man Hater has bucked off 37-of-42 (88.1%) potential riders.

In Houston, No. 2 Red Demon became the first animal athlete other than Man Hater to claim more than one Bull of the Event titles this season, marked an impressive 47 points for bucking off Joao Ricardo Vieira in 2.3 seconds in the championship round, rising to fourth in the standings. In Sioux Falls, the powerful bovine competitor won his third Bull of the Event title, bucking off Sage Kimzey in 3.07 seconds. Now 21-for-23 (91.3%) in his career after bucking off John Crimber in 5.07 seconds in Round 2 Friday night, Red Demon battles Dawson Branton in Round 4.

No. 4 Flyin Wired takes on Thiago Salgado in Round 4 to close out his showing at Cowtown Coliseum. A consistent presence in the Top 10 of the standings throughout the season, the powerful bovine competitor has bucked off 9 of 13 riders he has shared a chute with during the 2023-24 campaign, including Vitor Losnake in 2.09 seconds in Round 2 on Friday. The first ride Flyin Wired surrendered during the 2024 Unleash The Beast season was for a monstrous 91.75 points to Joao Ricardo Vieira in Tulsa, Oklahoma, tied for the third-highest score on the premier series this year. In his last out before World Finals, Flyin Wired was paired with Eliminations Round 1 winner Eduardo Aparecido, who covered him for 89.25 points in Billings, Montana, in mid-April. Flyin Wired has bucked off 19-of-24 (79.2%) potential riders in his career.

A new entry to the Top 5 after dispatching Caden Bunch in 4.1 seconds on Friday night, No. 5 Big Bank has been a consistent presence in the Top 10 and has bucked off 13 of the 14 riders he has faced this season. The only cowboy to make the 8 aboard the powerful bovine competitor was Brady Fielder, who topped him for 89 points in April in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. Big Bank is 27-for-30 (90%) in his career entering Sunday's action.
