

2024 Kid Rock's Rock N Rodeo AT&T Stadium – Arlington, Texas Friday, May 17 – 7:45 p.m. CDT

LET'S ROCK N' RODEO – For the first time in history on Friday, May 17, AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, hosts the revolutionary Kid Rock's Rock N Rodeo (KRRR). This million-dollar Team Rodeo mashed up with a Kid Rock concert features a discipline-specific, tournament-style bracket competition, as six all-star teams compete head-to-head in seven different Rodeo Disciplines – Bareback Riding, Steer Wrestling, Team Roping, Saddle Bronc Riding, Breakaway Roping, Tie-Down Roping, and Barrel Racing. Following the rodeo action, Kid Rock will perform live in concert. The event begins at 7:45 p.m. CDT.

THIS WEEKEND'S FORMAT – Kid Rock's Rock N Rodeo format is an innovative format with several elements relying on new technology advancements for Western sports. The event will feature four (4) total rounds of competition:

- Rounds 1, 2, and 3 will consist of each of the seven disciplines in an elimination bracket as follows:
 - Each of the first three rounds will be a series of discipline-specific head-to-head matchups against another team in a three-round tournament-style bracket. Discipline brackets will compete in the following order:
 - Barrel Racing Rounds 1-3
 - Bareback Riding Rounds 1-3
 - Steer Wrestling Rounds 1-3
 - Team Roping Rounds 1-3
 - Saddle Bronc Riding Rounds 1-3
 - Breakaway Roping Rounds 1-3
 - Tie-Down Roping Rounds 1-3
 - Advancement to Rounds 2 and 3 is discipline-specific and not the overall team. Example If a team loses their Saddle Bronc Riding matchup, that team will not advance in Saddle Bronc Riding but may advance in another discipline.
 - O Advancement to Round 2 will be the three (3) bracket head-to-head matchup winners and one (1) Wild Card athlete per discipline from the first round of competition.
 - Advancement to Round 3 will be the two (2) head-to-head matchup discipline winners from Round 2 of the bracket.
 - The Round 3 matchup winners in each discipline's bracket will be awarded a Gold Medal (for 1st place) and the Round 3 matchup loser will be awarded a Silver Medal (for 2nd place).
- **Shootout Round** Based on the Gold Medal Counts, the two (2) teams with the most Gold Medals (discipline bracket wins) will advance to the Shootout Round, where those two teams will face off head-to-head against each other. The first team to secure four discipline wins in the Shootout Round will clinch the event win.

In total, Kid Rock's Rock N' Rodeo will pay out \$1,000,000 in prize money to the athletes and coaches, with the winning team earning \$500,000. The remaining \$500,000 will be split among the other five team's athletes and coaches.

FAMILY TIES – Several competitors are matched with or against family members:

- The lone family coaching duo, Cody Ohl coaches Team Convoy along with his youngest daughter, Saylor Ohl.
- Shelby Boisjoli-Meged (Breakaway Roping) of Team Convoy is married to Haven Meged (Tie-Down Roping) on Team Jokers.

- Sid Steiner, head coach of Team Jokers, traded up to draft his son, Rocker Steiner (Bareback Riding), with the first overall pick and then selected his daughter, Steely Steiner (Barrel Racing) with the 67th overall pick.
- Cory Petska (Team Roping, heeler) of Team Jokers is married to Sherry Cervi (Barrel Racer) on Team Low Riders.
- Tuf Cooper's (Tie-Down Roping) sister, Shada, is married to his Head Coach on the Low Riders, Trevor Brazile.
- Brothers Logan and Dawson Hay of Team Sledgehammers compete alongside each other as the team's Saddle Bronc riders.

Cody Ohl (Coach) | Rosenburg, Texas

Calf roper, steer roper and team roper, Ohl delivered one of the most memorable debut seasons in the PRCA ranks when he was crowned the 1994 Rookie of the Year and qualified for his first NFR as a tie-down roper. In 1997 Ohl won his first World Championship when he edged Fred Whitfield by a mere \$5,031. The title would be Ohl's first of six, also winning the tie-down roping title in 1998, 2001, 2003 and 2006, and he was crowned the All-Around Champion in 2001. Ohl, who only missed one NFR qualification from 1994-2014, entered an elite group of competitors in 2012 when he crossed \$3 million in earnings.

Saylor Ohl (Assistant Coach) | Hico, Texas

The lone family coaching duo, Saylor Ohl is Cody Ohl's youngest daughter who recently turned 18 and is ready to make her impact on the professional scene. Growing up under the tutelage of her father, a six-time PRCA World Champion and 20-time National Finals Rodeo qualifier, Ohl is currently competing in arenas across the country as a breakaway roper, in tune with the newest talent set to take the rodeo world by storm.

Bobby Mote (Head Coach) | Portland, Oregon

Hailed by some as the greatest bareback rider in history, Mote in 2012 became the first to surpass \$2 million in earnings. He qualified for the NFR 15 consecutive years beginning in 2001. In 2002, Mote won his first of four PRCA bareback riding world championships, also riding supreme in 2007, 2009 and 2010. In his mid-20s Mote took up team roping, and in 2012 finished runner-up to Trevor Brazile in the All-Around Championship.

Linsay Rosser Sumpter (Assistant Coach) | La Junta, Colorado

Sumpter is a third-generation member of the Cotton Rosser rodeo family, granddaughter of Hall of Fame cowboy Cotton Rosser, growing up engrained in the Western lifestyle as she helped produce rodeos for the family's Flying U Company and worked as herd manager for Rosser Land and Cattle. A former collegiate rodeo competitor for California Polytechnic State University – San Luis Obispo, she continues to impress as a professional competitor and was named a Mountain States Circuit Finals qualifier. Additionally, Sumpter is no stranger to the coaching role or working alongside Mote. In addition to being Head Rodeo Coach for Otero College and a coach on BreakAwayRoping.com, Sumpter also serves as Commissioner for the Women's Rodeo World Championship, the largest all-female rodeo in the world. Outside of the arena, Sumpter, who holds a master's degree in mass communication, is married to six-time National Finals Rodeo qualifying steer wrestler Wade Sumpter and the proud mother of two.

NOTE: The Free Riders are the lone team formed independent of the Kid Rock's Rock N Rodeo Draft. The Free Riders were fielded based on the WCRA's (World Champion Rodeo Alliance) Major rodeo in Corpus Christi, Texas, Rodeo Corpus Christi, which concluded on May 11. The Top 2 athletes in each discipline not already drafted to one of the other five teams earned a chance to ride for the Free Riders.

Sid Steiner (Head Coach) | Austin, Texas

World Champion steer wrestler Steiner, a trailblazing showman who competed from 1995 to 2002, hails from a family with a rich rodeo history. A fourth-generation member of legendary rodeo producers Buck and Tommy of Steiner Rodeo Company, Sid is the son of 2005 PBR Ring of Honor inductee and 1973 RCA World Champion bull rider Bobby Steiner. During his career, Steiner, who sported a variety of tattoos and piercings, was nicknamed "Sid Rock" for his charisma and showmanship. After being crowned World Champion in 2002, Steiner retired.

Joe Beaver (Assistant Coach) | Victoria, Texas

Beaver is one of the most accomplished ropers in Western sports, a three-time PRCA All-Around World Champion and five-time Tie-Down Roping World Champion. He qualified for the National Finals Rodeo 22 times, winning the All-Around average three times, and the Tie-Down Roping average four times. During his career of more than a decade, Beaver amassed more than \$1.5 million in earnings. He has since been inducted into the National Rodeo Hall of Fame and Pro Rodeo Hall of Fame, among others.

Trevor Brazile (Head Coach) | Amarillo, Texas

Brazile is arguably the greatest-ever all-around cowboy, competing in tie-down roping, team roping (as both header and heeler) and steer roping, winning an unprecedented 26 World Championships during his career. Called by some "King of the Cowboys" he is the only PRCA contender to have won more than \$7 million. Brazile is the only other cowboy to qualify for the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo (WNFR) in four events.

Dale Brisby (Assistant Coach) | Newcastle, Texas

Brisby has been a champion for the Western lifestyle on social media, with his wily antics amassing a following of more than 1 million on Instagram, 936K on Facebook, 599K on YouTube, and 45K on X. He has collaborated with some of the most well-known rodeo events and competitors to ever take to the dirt. A self-described legendary bull-riding gypsy soul, Brisby is also known for his hit Netflix show How To Be A Cowboy and his work with two-time PBR World Champion J.B. Mauney at Buck Town. For Brisby, it's always Rodeo Time.

Fred Whitfield (Head Coach) | Hockley, Texas

Whitfield is one of the most decorated Black cowboys in rodeo history. He is a seven-time tie-down roping PRCA world champion and was once crowned the all-around champion, while also winning the NFR average in tie-down roping four times. When Whitfield won the 1991 tie-down roping title, he became the second Black cowboy in PRCA history to win a world title, and then became the first Black Western sports athlete to win an all-around title in 1999. A 20-time WNFR qualifier, his 10-head total of 84.0 seconds en route to the aggregate title in 1997 is regarded as one of the WNFR's greatest performances.










