

General Environmental Conditions Eindhoven Airport N.V.

Applicability of general environmental conditions

- 1. These terms and conditions apply to all agreements between Eindhoven Airport N.V. and the contractor regarding the contractor's activities, services and goods and the use of the civilian part of military airbase Eindhoven, in the broadest sense of the words, involving the environment.
- 2. The applicability of any other terms and conditions that may be used by the contractor or where the contractor is referred in in any form shall be expressly rejected.

A. General environmental conditions

- 1. The contractor should be familiar with the (legal) environmental conditions, regulations and requirements that may relate to the activities, provided services and goods by the contractor. The current environmental permit of Eindhoven Airport NV environmental permit of Eindhoven Airport N.V. is available on request from the environmental coordinator of Eindhoven Airport N.V.
- 2. The contractor must indicate whether the organization has an environmental management system and if this system meets the applicable standard for example of ISO14001/EMAS.
- 3. The contractor must report any changes to environmentally relevant activities directly to the environmental coordinator of Eindhoven Airport N.V., so that the changes can be tested against applicable environmental laws and regulations.
- 4. The activities and used materials shall not cause any harm, damage or inconvenience other than strictly necessary. If this cannot be demonstrated unambiguously, prior written consent of the Eindhoven Airport Environment Coordinator N.V. is required for carrying out the activities or the use of resources.
- 5. When performing work at the airport, the contractor must, if necessary, take environmental protection measures and / or have a work permit approved by Eindhoven Airport N.V.
- 6. The contractor is obliged to report environmental incidents directly to the Airport Operations Manager at Eindhoven Airport NV, via telephone number: 040 291 98 23. An environmental incident means any event that differs from normal business activities causing or threatening adverse effects on the environment, such as, but not limited to, emissions or effects on air, odor, (soil) water, noise, soil and safety

B. Noise

- The contractor must know what the noise levels are of his activities, deliverable goods and services at the airport and must have this information available on request of Eindhoven Airport N.V.
- 2. Noise producing activities should be minimized and should be limited to work activities. Noise producing equipment and devices may be used to carry out the activities, the supplies or services to the extent necessary and must comply with the best available techniques.
- 3. An expected exceedance of the noise regulations should be reported in advance to the environmental coordinator of Eindhoven Airport NV, so appropriate measures can be taken.
- 4. Unexpected and unavoidable exceedance of the noise requirements must be reported immediately to the environmental coordinator Eindhoven Airport NV.

C. Soil

- 1. Soil risk of contractor's soil-threatening activities must meet a negligible soil risk by combining measures and facilities, as defined in the NRB 2012.
- 2. When working with potentially soil polluting substances, adequate measures must be taken (eg technical facilities) and working instructions must be present aiming to avoid any contamination of soil and/or groundwater (eg by leakage and spills). When performing work at the airport, the contractor must have a work permit approved by Eindhoven Airport N.V.





- 3. Leakage, spillage and any other soil pollution resulting from work carried out by the contractor must be cleaned up and disposed of immediately, in accordance with the applicable procedure and has to be reported directly to the Airport Operations Manager at Eindhoven Airport NV, via telephone number: 040 291 98 23to .
- 4. Packaging or containers with environmentally harmful substances should be checked periodically for damage and/or leaks. The frequency of the inspection should be determined in consultation with the environmental coordinator of Eindhoven Airport NV.
- 5. Any damage or leakage should be corrected immediately according to the applicable procedure and reported in writing to the environmental coordinator of Eindhoven Airport NV.
- 6. When soil-destructive activities are about to be terminated, the contractor must report this to the environmental coordinator of Eindhoven Airport N.V. so that a final investigation can be carried out for the determination of soil quality.

D. Water (waste water and rainwater)

- 1. The contractor must be able to present an overview of the activities, resources, products or services carried out by him that can cause contamination of the waste water and/or sewage. This also includes taking preventive measures contamination of waste water and/or sewage.
- 2. The cleaning of equipment, vehicles or aircraft may only take place at areas specified by Eindhoven Airport NV. The user may only use those detergents and cleaning materials that do not harm the environment. The requirements of paragraph 1 shall apply.
- 3. When cleaning materials, vehicles or aircraft no product mist may occur which may spread outside Eindhoven Airport territory.

E. Air

- 1. The contractor is obligated that, when using equipment, air emission is limited only to the necessary activity level. Unnecessary use of equipment or material is not allowed
- 2. The contractor shall ensure that, when using equipment, the emission do not have any negative consequences for air quality (including, for example, the concentration of fine dust in the open air).

F. Waste

- 1. When performing activities, provision of services and goods by the contractor, creation of waste should be avoided or minimized.
- 2. The contractor is obligated to separate different waste streams, focused on possible reuse.
- 3. All waste should be deposited in consultation with the environmental coordinator of Eindhoven Airport NV. For this the waste park of Eindhoven Airport must be used. The dischargeable waste must not interfere, damage or cause inconvenience other than strictly necessary. If this cannot be verified, written approval of the environmental coordinator of Eindhoven Airport NV is necessary.
- 4. The contractor must keep a record of the waste coming from his activities, supply of goods and/or services. By using these waste records, the waste performance of various contractors and subcontractors can be registered. Each year, the performance of waste from Eindhoven Airport NV will be published.

G. Water and Energy

1. The contractor shall make maximum use of energy saving measures in performing the work and supply of services and goods. The contractor should pursue implementation of energy reduction measures. However, this may not be detrimental to the work or supply of goods or services that has been agreed upon with Eindhoven Airport NV.





H. Safety

- 1. The contractor shall ensure that his employees are familiar with the applicable health and safety, environmental, fire regulations and procedures in case of incidents or emergencies.
- 2. Any incidents or emergencies should be reported directly to the Airport Operations Manager at Eindhoven Airport NV.
