

6 THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT MEN'S WEDDING ATTIRE

- Roughly 50% of grooms are wearing a suit on their wedding day
- Style and price are the most important features in the decision-making process
- The majority spend between \$100 \$300 when purchasing a suit
- Nearly 80% of grooms are aware of Men's Wearhouse
- Forty-five percent of grooms find it important to visit a brick-and-mortar store to see a suit/tux
- The majority of groomsmen are asked to rent a suit

GROOMS ATTIRE

Nearly 50% of grooms decide on wearing a suit for their wedding day attire, followed by a tux (27%). Interestingly, data shows that around 20% are choosing neither option — further demonstrating that couples are personalizing their big day to meet their needs (and attire is no exception).




GROOMS PURCHASING DECISION

MAKING THE PURCHASE

Despite the many options, those who decide on **wearing** a suit are nearly 2X as likely to buy it vs. those who wear a tux. While the majority of grooms spend anywhere between \$100 - \$300 on purchasing a suit, nearly 30% spend between \$300 - \$500.





BRAND AWARENESS


Due to the large selection, affordable options and convenience of a one-stop-shop for all wedding fashion needs (ie. cufflinks, ties, etc.), Men's Wearhouse is well known among nearly 80% of grooms.

Though couples find it important to see a suit/tux in person, 56% say they would be willing to purchase attire from an online only retailer.

WEDDING PARTY ATTIRE

It may come as no surprise that the **majority of groomsmen** are asked to wear a suit (62%) for the wedding day (as opposed to 27% who wear a tux). Unlike bridesmaids where the majority purchase their dress, nearly 60% of groomsmen are asked to rent their suit or tux.





When it comes to the overall look of groomsmen...

39% will wear matching attire

38% will coordinate their attire with bridesmaids

23% will wear a different suit/ tux than the groom
