SCHOOL CALENDAR

Enrollment Dates

Enrollment for real estate appraiser education is continuously open, subject to program availability.

Beginning and Ending Dates

The CE Shop's Real Estate Appraiser Qualifying Education courses expire 6 months after the date of purchase. Each student will be granted a 1-month extension at no charge. For any reactivation or extension of the course after the 7th month, The CE Shop will charge the student 20% of the current retail price of the course for each 30-day extension or partial 30-day extension in the event that the course finally terminates before the end of the final 30-day extension. Students may also elect to re-enroll for 50% of the current retail price of the course, if the course has hit the year expiration or the student is at the 7-month mark and wants to repurchase and restart the course and enrollment. Extensions or reactivations cannot be granted beyond 12 months from the purchase of the course. If the course is not completed within 12 months from the original date of purchase, the student will be required to purchase a new course at 50% of the current retail price.

REFUND POLICY

The course material emphasizes the role of the appraiser and the impartiality associated with this role. Special responsibilities of the appraiser with regard to impartiality are explored in detail. All required manuals from The Appraisal Foundation are included in your course. This course is offered via live online (synchronous) delivery.

The course also dives into types of and approaches to value, influences on real estate, economic principles, and real estate markets. The course closes on the ethics in theory and practice of appraisal along with valuation bias, fair housing, and equal opportunity that will be top of mind in an appraisal practice. This course is offered via asynchronous online delivery.
