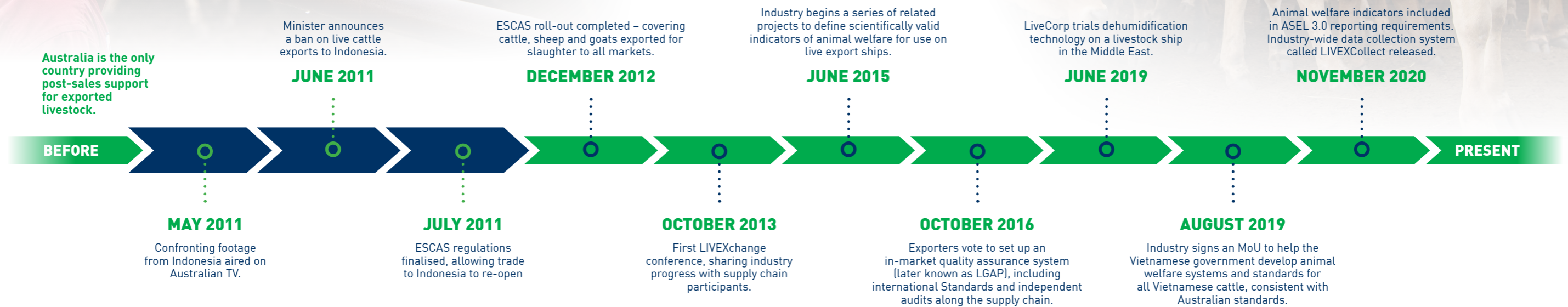


A DECADE OF CHANGE IN LIVE EXPORTS



FAST FACTS

Local Animal Welfare Officers appointed in every approved feedlot and abattoir in Indonesia to oversee compliance with ESCAS and provide training.

Stunning used by more than 90% of Indonesian abattoirs approved to slaughter Australian cattle.

12,000 people trained in animal handling, husbandry and slaughter practices in overseas markets between 2011 and 2018.

Australia exports around a million cattle to more than 20 countries each year.

Around 99.9% of cattle exported from Australia arrive safely at their destination – a rate that has been maintained for more than a decade.

Farmers retain 40-57% of the revenue generated in Australia by live cattle exports.

KEY

The Exporter Supply Chain Assurance System (ESCAS) means exporters are responsible for the welfare of livestock in-market, to the point of slaughter.

The Livestock Global Assurance Program (LGAP) takes ESCAS to the next level, with higher standards, better reporting and greater accountability for animal welfare in market.

The Australian Standards for the Export of Livestock (ASEL) outline strict requirements around animal welfare from Australian farms to arrival in market.
