



This has not only helped me develop in my job role but has inspired me to develop more skills in other areas outside of work.



Code of Conduct



All ambassadors are required to follow the following key principles:


- be friendly and welcoming to all
- be supportive of and committed to other ambassadors
- respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants, regardless of age, gender, ability, race, cultural background, religious beliefs or sexual identity
- be aware when using social media that offensive content such as racial, ethnic, sexual, religious or physical disability slurs will not be tolerated
- report inappropriate behaviour to <u>aan.enquiries@education.gov.uk</u>
- keep yourself safe
- not consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on any premises whilst representing your regional or national network






