Magical I Am calls these words "Sight Words" and more specifically as Abstract Words because the majority (86%) of these 100 words are abstract words.

Educators and groups (e.g., Fry, Dolch) all have their own list of "Sight Words" to learn ... words that are to be recognized "on sight" without applying the rules of phonics or phonetics to them.
