What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Growth Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Fisher Funds Management Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The fund aims to grow your savings with more focus on capital growth over the long term. Invested in mainly growth assets.

The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.



How has the fund performed?

Annual return graph



This shows the return after fund charges and tax for each year ending 31 March since the fund started. The last bar shows the average annual return since the fund started, up to 31 December 2016.

What fees are investors charged?

Investors in the Growth Fund are charged fund charges. In the year to 31 March 2016 these were:

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Example of how this applies to an investor

Sarah had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Sarah received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$484 (that is 4.84% of her initial \$10,000). Sarah also paid \$36 in other charges. This gives Sarah a total return after tax of \$448.00 for the year.

What does the fund invest in?

Currency hedging

The benchmark currency hedge ratios for each asset class (hedged into NZD) are: International fixed interest 100%; Listed property (overseas portion) 70%; Australian equities 70%; International equities 50%.

Notes

¹ The negative performance-based fee expense as at 31 March 2016 is a result of the actual performance fee charged to the fund at 30 June 2015 (0.30%) being lower than the fee accrued to 31 March 2016 (0.32%). Because the performance fee period runs from 1 July to 30 June each year and the calculation period for fees disclosed in the fund update runs from 1 April to 31 March each year, negative performance fee accruals as at 31 March are possible in these types of situations. The performance-based fee accrual is calculated on a daily basis. See the product disclosure statement for more information about the basis on which performance fees are charged.
