COVID-19: FORGING A PATH FORWARD

CARES Act Support for State and Local Governments

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) provides substantial appropriations to assist state and local governments with the financial impacts of COVID-19. There are various funding provisions that state and local governments will be able to participate in, each of which has differing eligibility and reporting requirements.

MGO understands the complexities of this historic Act and in an effort to provide support and clarity to our state and local government clients we have summarized some of the significant funding sources by type, total monies allotted, general purpose, and eligible parties.

| Low Income Home Energy Assistance Grants | \$900 M | To assist low-income households affected by COVID-19 that pay a high proportion of household income for home energy | States |
| Head Start Act | \$750 M | Operate supplemental summer programs to help reduce the effects of school closures on learning opportunities | Eligible agencies |
