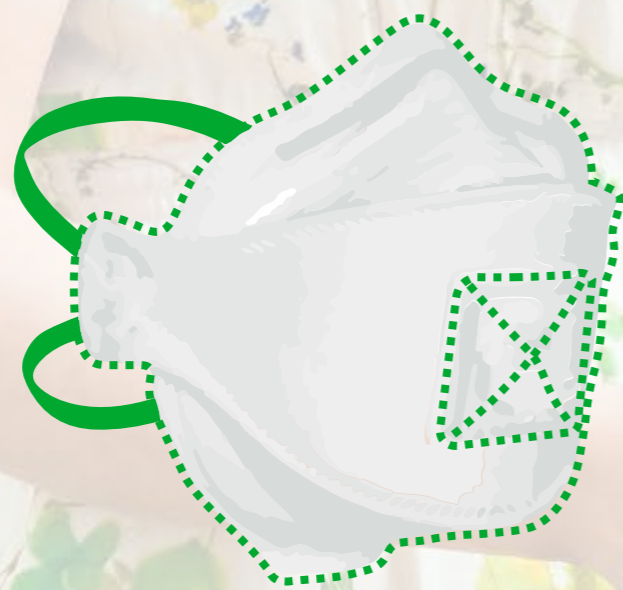
Surgical masks and respirators have to be CE marked and manufacturer information need to be found from the labeling

This personal protective equipment is a respirator. Filters particle and liquid aerosols when put on tightly. It is FFP2 or FFP3 class. They are usually equipped with valve which protects respirator from moisture.



This is not personal protective equipment or respirator. It reduces exposure to pathogens in situations that pose a risk of droplet infection. Can be used by an ill person in order to prevent infecting others when coughing or sneezing.
