A LITERACY REVOLUTION FOR THE ROHINGYA

The project addresses the educational crisis facing Rohingya children in refugee camps in Bangladesh by providing them with access to high-quality education in their own language. Children on the Edge supports more than 6,300 children in the world's largest refugee camp: Kutupalong and on the island of Bhasan Char. Since Rohingya children are not allowed to learn the national language Bengali and at the same time have to follow a Burmese curriculum that they hardly understand, this creates a major barrier to learning. The introduction and teaching of the "Hanifi" writing system — a script developed specifically by the Rohingya — actively addresses this challenge.

AGUA SANA

This project provides clean drinking water in Guatemala by significantly reducing pollution in Lake Atitlán - a vital water source for the local population - through innovative greywater treatment. Around 70,000 people are benefiting from improved health as a result. The greywater is first collected and purified using septic filter systems before being further clarified via an underground irrigation system using native plants. This simple, cost-effective and easily replicable method not only protects the lake's fragile ecosystem, but also strengthens the long-term well-being of the community.

THE ZENA LAUNCHPAD

This is an effective educational program in Kamuli, Uganda, that supports women from rural areas living below the poverty line. In a one-year program, participants acquire practical entrepreneurial skills that enable them to start their own businesses after graduation. Through fixed-term employment contracts, the women not only receive a solid education, but also an income, 60% of which they can set aside each month as start-up capital. Graduates of the Zena Launchpad thus create new sources of income for their families and contribute to the long-term economic empowerment of their communities.

BREAKING BARRIERS IN DENGUE DETECTION

This project has developed an innovative microneedle patch as a self-test that allows people in remote regions to diagnose dengue fever easily, painlessly, and safely at home. The patch takes a small blood sample and detects both early and recurrent infections. This improves healthcare, relieves overburdened systems, and enables early action against dengue fever.

PATHWAYS OF RESILIENCE: WELLNESS & TRAUMA RECOVERY

This project is revolutionizing trauma treatment in the conflict-ridden region of Ituri in eastern Democratic Republic of Congo. It supports 1,500 women and young people with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) through a combination of narrative exposure therapy, mobile outreach work, and traditional forest rituals. Conducted by local health workers and peer mentors, the project links mental health with culture, community, and nature. In this way, it not only promotes individual healing, but also strengthens interpersonal relationships, cultural identity, and sustainable community structures.

These ambassadors are trained to identify unvaccinated children, accompany families to health services, and provide information on Using vaccination. culturally sensitive communication, storytelling, and a mobile app for real-time data collection, the project promotes behavioral change and improves access to basic medical care for around 200,000 people.


