Overview of Learning Model Data from the COVID-19 School Data Hub

The CSDH includes learning model data for K-12 public schools as provided by state agencies (e.g., departments of education or health), which can be accessed here: <https://www.covidschooldatahub.com/>. State data files do not include private schools, schools serving only as pre-kindergarten/early childhood centers, student services spanning multiple school districts, homeschool programs, residential programs, programs designed for youth ages 18-21, exclusively or primarily online/virtual schools, or adult programs.

CSDH files are organized into a consistent structure across states, and have been matched to NCES IDs and NCES school/district type. This information can be used in conjunction with the NCES school and district demographic files here: https://www.covidschooldatahub.com/for_researchers. Learning models are defined for the purposes of our dataset as follows:

- **In-person:** All or most students received instruction in person, 5 days a week.
- **Hybrid:** All or most students received a blend of in-person and virtual instruction.
- **Virtual:** All or most students received instruction virtually, 5 days a week.

The learning model data that were publicly available or submitted to CSDH upon request are presented as the state's best knowledge about the learning model status of their schools and districts. The data have been cleaned and standardized, but CSDH has not conducted additional verification of this information. All learning model data are available in csv and Excel formats. In some cases, the learning model information provided by state agencies was collected as part of the state's plan to determine and disburse benefits as part of the Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer (P-EBT) program through the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Enrollment total	The EnrollmentTotal variable presents Washington’s K-12 student enrollment data for the 2020-21 school year for each district, as reported by OSPI, accessible here: Report Card Enrollment 2020-21 School Year Data.WA State of Washington . This is a count of all students enrolled by the first business day in October, 2020. For each district, the official EnrollmentTotal is applied across all time periods.										
Additional state learning model data details	Washington’s learning modality data for the 2020-21 school year were collected in different formats over the course of the 2020-21 school year. Below, we outline the data sources and details.										



	<p><u>September 2020-November 2020 Data</u> The Fall 2020 survey of district learning modality was distributed by the Association of Educational Services District (AESD). It was a monthly look, retrospective to the last week of the preceding month. OSPI provided the monthly district-level fall 2020 data to CSDH in response to a data request.</p> <p><u>December 2020 Data</u> Washington's December 2020 data are sourced from the state's Pandemic Electronic Benefits Transfer program (P-EBT), which provided monetary benefits to students who were involved in at least some remote learning. Monthly school-level data were compiled by the Washington Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS). Only one month of P-EBT data were used for CSHD purposes for the majority of schools, given that OSPI was able to provide data for the remaining months of the school year. P-EBT data were used for two schools for Sep-Dec 2020 due to missing fall AESD survey data: Washington Center for Deaf and Hard of Hearing Youth and the Office of the Governor (Sch for Blind).</p> <p><u>Spring 2021 Data</u> OSPI administered weekly district modality surveys beginning January 18, 2021. The weekly spring 2021 data was captured from a full dataset of school districts' reopening plans via OSPI's website: https://www.k12.wa.us/about-ospi/press-releases/novel-coronavirus-covid-19-guidance-resources/school-reopening-data. The state provides a public FAQ document about the publicly-accessible data here: https://www.k12.wa.us/sites/default/files/public/StudentInformation/ReportingFAQforDistricts.pdf.</p> <p><u>Grade-Band Data</u> Learning model status and learning model enrollment data were reported from 3 grade bands (elementary, middle, and high school). Only in-person enrollment counts and full-time ALE counts were collected, but not hybrid or virtual counts. For this reason, the sum of EnrollmentInPerson, EnrollmentHybrid, and EnrollmentVirtual does not equal EnrollmentTotal. Learning model classifications by grade band are not provided where the state did not provide a grade-band classification.</p> <p><u>LearningModel Variable</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Sep-Nov 2020: CSDH generated the LearningModel variable based on the <i>predominant</i> (most common) learning model used among the three grade bands each month.● Dec 2020: The LearningModel variable represents the <i>predominant</i> (most common) learning model used among schools within that district that month, according to P-EBT data. Where there were an equal number of schools using different models, the district is classified according to the most in-person approach.● Jan-May 2021: Using the weekly data, CSDH first generated the LearningModel variable based on the <i>predominant</i> (most common) learning model used among the three grade bands each month. Next, the monthly learning model was determined to be the predominant (most common) learning model used in each district during each month. Where there were an equal number of weeks during which a district used different models, the district is classified according to the most in-person approach.
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	<p><u>In-Person Enrollment Data</u></p> <p>The OSPI weekly district survey collected weekly in-person enrollment counts (but not hybrid or virtual enrollment counts) beginning the week of January 18, 2021. The EnrollmentInPerson variable reflects the <i>maximum</i> in-person enrollment reported within each district over the course of each month. In some cases, districts may have reported the learning model to be in-person or partial in-person, but also indicated “0” for in-person enrollment; these inconsistencies reflect the original data as reported.</p>
Staff counts	<p>District-level staff counts represent total full-time equivalency (FTE) counts for certificated and classified staff for the 2020-21 school year, publicly available from the state website here: https://www.k12.wa.us/sites/default/files/public/safs/pub/per/2021/StfPro.pdf</p> <p>. Staff count FTEs represent the sum total of certificated instructional staff, certificated administrative staff, and classified staff by district, as presented in Table 45B. Note that staff FTE counts were not available for the Washington Center for Deaf and Hard of Hearing Youth and the Office of the Governor (Sch for Blind). In-person staff counts were not available.</p>
