

Truck Classification


TRUCK TYPE | GROSS VEHICLE WEIGHT RATING (GVWR)





Class 1 Light Duty | GVWR: 6,000 lbs. or less

If a trailer is towed and the Gross Combination Weight Rating (GCWR) of the vehicle and trailer exceeds 10,000 lbs., the truck may require DOT compliance.





Class 2 Light Duty | GVWR: 6,001 to 10,000 lbs.

If a trailer is towed and the GCWR of the vehicle and trailer exceeds 10,000 lbs., the truck may require DOT compliance.





Class 3 Medium Duty | GVWR: 10,001 to 14,000 lbs.

All trucks and vans from Class 3-8 require DOT compliance.





Class 4 Medium Duty | GVWR: 14,001 to 16,000 lbs.

All trucks and vans from Class 3-8 require DOT compliance.





Class 5 Medium Duty | GVWR: 16,001 to 19,500 lbs.

All trucks and vans from Class 3-8 require DOT compliance.

TRUCK CLASSIFICATION

TRUCK TYPE | GROSS VEHICLE WEIGHT RATING (GVWR)



Class 6 Medium Duty | GVWR: 19,501 to 26,000 lbs.

Class A Commercial Driver License (CDL) is required if pulling a trailer over 10,000 lbs. GVWR.





Class 7 Medium Duty | GVWR: 26,001 to 33,000 lbs.

Class B CDL is required, and a Class A CDL is required if pulling a trailer over 10,000 lbs. GVWR.





Class 8 Heavy Duty | GVWR: over 33,000 lbs.

Class A CDL is required if pulling a trailer over 10,000 lbs. GVWR and Class B CDL without the trailer.

CDL license classification requirements vary by state and in some cases local jurisdiction. It is very important to closely review the federal, state and local requirements to avoid compliance problems.
