



WHERE TO START:

Grabbing a bagel from award-winning bagel shop **Bagelsaurus** is a must when in Porter Square. With a bagel in hand, stroll down Mass Ave towards the **Cambridge Common**, and on your walk you'll pass **Lesley University**, established in 1909. Enjoy your breakfast and coffee in this lovely park, famous for its ties to the American Revolution. After enjoying the green space and historic monuments, visit **Sign of the Dove Gallery** for locally made art, including handcrafted jewelry.

IN THE AFTERNOON:

Speaking of **Cambridge Common**, the restaurant by the same name serves an incredible burger and other comfort dishes in a welcoming neighborhood setting. Or, visit **Yume Wo Katare** (Japanese for "Share Your Dreams"), which has been featured multiple times on *Time Out Boston's* list of "Best Ramen Restaurants". After a hearty meal, browse the local stores at **Porter Square Shopping Center**. Explore the shelves in **Porter Square Books**, a locally owned store that sells both contemporary and antique books. Keep the shopping spree going with a trip to **Mudflat Gallery** featuring ceramics and art. Once you've shopped till you drop, indulge in **Honeycomb Creamery's** made from scratch ice cream tacos.

AFTER DARK:

According to *Eater Boston*, one of the best Italian spots in the Cambridge and Boston area is **Giulia**. Head over to this cozy restaurant for dinner, and make sure to try their homemade pasta. If you want a little more variety, visit **Barcelona Wine Bar** for tapas and 400+ varieties of wine. After dinner, visit **Lizard Lounge** for live local music, open mic nights and popular poetry slams.
