

# WHERE TO START:

Start the day off with a hot (or iced!) cup of joe and pastry from 1369 Coffee House. Take your coffee to go and visit North Point Park, an ideal spot for a morning picnic or walk along the Charles River. Those more daring can skateboard at the Lynch Family Skate park, funded in part by professional skater Tony Hawk. After enjoying some fresh air, head to the Museum of Science where children and adults of all ages will be entertained for hours. And, don't let the museum's Boston address fool you - it actually straddles the Boston and Cambridge city line, but is on the Cambridge side of the Charles River!

### IN THE AFTERNOON:

All are welcome to play within the 11 acres of green space and soccer fields at **Cambridge Crossing**, who offer free sport equipment rentals. After working up an appetite, cross the street and grab a bite at **The Lexington** with its beautiful greenhouse-inspired decor. After lunch, pop next door to **Lamplighter Brewing Co.** for a beer brewed right in Cambridge. East Cambridge is also home to **CambridgeSide**, an indoor shopping mall sure to satisfy your inner shopper. Or, walk to the canal behind the mall and catch a sightseeing cruise with the **Charles River Boat Company**, offering mesmerizing views of both Cambridge and Boston.

## **AFTER DARK:**

Oleana is the perfect spot to unwind after a long day, featuring dishes by James Beard Award-winning Chef Ana Sortun that taste even better than they look. Or, dine riverside at Royal Sonesta Hotel at their ArtBar or their brand new restaurant, MonteVerdi. End your night with a pint of Guinness at the Druid a traditional Irish pub featuring live music.
