Home to the "Most Innovative Square Mile on the Planet", Kendall Square is the tech hub of Cambridge. Start your morning off with a breakfast sandwich from Mamaleh's Delicatessen, and head off on a student-led tour of Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) by Trademark Tours, where you'll go inside some of the most iconic buildings on campus and find out exactly what a Smoot is. Or, choose instead to visit the MIT Museum, where you'll get the chance to peruse an exciting array of exhibits of artificial intelligence, architecture, three-dimensional holograms and their famous Kismet robot.

### IN THE AFTERNOON:

Grab lunch from another invention of MIT, Clover Food Lab, whose mission is to make you dream about vegetables, save the world and make your meal in less than 3.5 minutes. Still want more tech & innovation? Join the Innovation Trail Tour, which will teach you about Cambridge's innovative past, present and future, including the Tootsie Roll, Polaroid Camera and the COVID-19 vaccine. Or, if your brain needs a break, do some thrifting at the famous Garment District, play a game of pickleball at the Urban Park Roof Garden or rent a kayak from Paddle Boston and enjoy a relaxing float down the Charles River.

# **AFTER DARK:**

Sumiao Hunan Kitchen is a great option for authentic yet modern Asian cuisine, or, if Mexican food on a roof deck is calling your name then Mex Taqueria is your spot. Afterwards, grab a beer at Cambridge Brewing Co. featuring locally brewed beers on tap, such as the Charles River Porter. Satisfy your sweet tooth before bed at Toscanini's, recognized in both Courmet Magazine and the New York Times for their amazing flavors like Burnt Caramel and Fluffah Nuttah Buttah.
