



WHERE TO START:

Start the morning with breakfast at **La Saison**, a French bakery named as one of the “15 Most Essential Bakeries” by *Eater Boston*. After, rent a Blue Bike and cycle to **Mount Auburn Cemetery**, the country’s first garden cemetery, established in 1831. This 175-acre cemetery is a picturesque place for a morning stroll, bird watching, or enjoying a variety of horticultural and sculptural art. Climb the 92 steps of the **Washington Tower** for a one-of-a-kind view of the Charles River and Boston.

IN THE AFTERNOON:

Stop by the decadent wine and cheese shop **Formaggio Kitchen** and grab some picnic essentials to bring to **Magazine Beach**. Located on Memorial Drive, this park is a great place to enjoy views of the Charles River. Take a dip in Magazine Beach’s Olympic-sized swimming pool or let little ones cool off on the splash pads, both open seasonally. After soaking in the sun, head over to **Summer Shack** for some of the best New England lobster rolls in town.

AFTER DARK:

Overlooking Memorial Drive and the Charles River, **Paperback Tavern**, located inside the **Hyatt Regency Boston Cambridge**, is a fantastic option for dinner. Or, **Talulla’s** offers another perfect spot for an elevated dining experience. The 5-course tasting menu is curated by a husband and wife team nominated by the James Beard Foundation for “Best Chef: Northeast” in 2024. Then, end the evening with a cocktail crafted with locally sourced ingredients at **Freepoint Kitchen and Cocktails**.
