

WHERE TO START:

Start the day off in this iconic Square with a delicious breakfast from Henrietta's Table at The Charles Hotel, a hot-spot for morning meetings of Harvard dignitaries and local celebrities. After, walk along "Tory Row" on elegant Brattle Street and you'll find Longfellow House, Washington's Headquarters National Historic Site. General George Washington occupied the residence when he took command of the Continental Army in 1775, and it was later home to noted American poet Henry Wadsworth Longfellow.

IN THE AFTERNOON:

Grab a slice from the famous **Pinnochio's**, a local pizzeria that is a favorite of Harvard University students. Or, visit the iconic **Hong Kong Restaurant** that has been serving Mai Tai's and Chinese food since 1954. Sweet tooth? Indulge in a world-famous cannoli from **Mike's Pastry**, one of four locations they have within the Boston area. Then, join a student-led tour of **Harvard University** by **Trademark Tours** and learn about America's birthplace of higher education. Or, opt to visit any of seven museums that call Harvard Square home, such as the **Harvard Museum of Natural History** or the free **Harvard Art Museum**.

AFTER DARK:

Fans of former Cambridge resident Julia Child cannot miss **Harvest**, one of her favorite restaurants in the city. Or, enjoy a larger than life burger at **Mr. Bartley's**, a burger cottage serving dishes named after local celebrities such as Jayson Tatum and Jennifer Coolidge. Don't miss the opportunity to take in a classic or foreign film at **Brattle Street Theater**, which has been showing movies in Harvard Square since 1953. **Wusong Road** is a perfect place for a nightcap with fun Asian-inspired cocktails, and was recently named "Most Beautiful Bar in Massachusetts" by *People*.
