

WHERE TO START:

Start your day at the retro **Donut Villa Diner** where classic dishes get a modern twist. Keep the vintage vibes alive by shopping at **Great Eastern Trading Co.**, **Pandemonium Books and Games** or the plethora of many local shops found in Central Square. After shopping, head over to **Graffiti Alley** - a legal street art space - at Richard B. "Rico" Modica Way and leave your mark on Cambridge!

IN THE AFTERNOON:

Continue exploring Central Square by joining the Off the Beaten Path's Food and Mural Arts Tour or join Christopher Street's LGBTQ+ History Tour, which departs from Cambridge's iconic City Hall. Then for lunch, take a cooking class hosted by James Beard-nominated Chef Tracy Chang at PAGU. Whether you opt for their sushi or hand-pulled noodle class, this incredible experience is not to be missed.

AFTER DARK:

Grab dinner at the newly opened Althea at the 907 Main Hotel, featuring an outdoor patio with a retractable roof and shipping container bar. Central Square is also the live music destination of Cambridge, home to Cantab Lounge, The Middle East, and The Mad Monkfish. Or, see what's playing Central Square Theater, known for performances that explore social justice, science and gender politics through theater. end the evening by grabbing a cocktail and playing nostalgic arcade games like Ms. Pac-Man or Super Mario at the speakeasy style bar Roxy's Arcade.
