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Trade Practices Compliance Notice





GS1 Australia Trade Practice Compliance Notice

Participants on GS1 Boards, committees, task forces, work groups, or other similar bodies, must always remember the purpose of the Board, committee, task force, or work group is to enhance the ability of all industry members to compete more efficiently and effectively to provide better value to the consumer or end user. GS1 activity almost always involves the cooperation of competitors; therefore great care must be taken to assure compliance with trade practices laws in Australia and in other jurisdictions

This means:

- Participation must be voluntary.
- There will no exchange of confidential information such as prices products.
- Meetings will have a pre-prepared agenda and recorded by minutes.
- All recommendations from any meeting are recommendations only. Individual companies remain free to make independent, competitive decisions.
- Any standards developed must be voluntary standards.
- If any participant believes the group is drifting toward impermissible discussion, the topic shall be tabled until the opinion of lawyer(s) with experience in trade practices law can be obtained.

Data Quality Improvement





Data quality starts with clarity



- National Product Catalogue is not a technical/IT solution it is a community based data sharing environment that has a technical component (based on a set of global standards)
- Three distinct main roles in the NPC that are critical to ensuring data quality and ultimately value for the user community and Australian healthcare
- Each party involved needs to participate, subscribing and doing a minimum is not enough to ensure that there is value
- GS1 cannot (and will not) be the only party driving improvements to quality or the use of the NPC – we provide support, and assist both suppliers and recipients but we do not sit within the community that uses the data,
- Data in the NPC belongs to the company providing it GS1 does not create/edit/'crowd source' the data – it comes directly from the supplier to their chosen recipients, passing through validations and cross referenced to prompt the maintenance of basic requirements
