## Some highlights from 2020

- Improvements to Patient Safety and Global harmonisation of healthcare were once again highlighted in the [Reference Book](#) this year with case studies from hospitals, wholesalers and manufacturers who have documented benefits from implementing standards.
- The [GS1 Healthcare Online Summit](#) replaced our face to face conferences with 582 participants representing over 80 countries.
- Updated [GTIN Allocation rules for Healthcare](#) were published.
- Regulations continue to evolve the world over, including local consultations related to [Barcoding and serialisation of Medicines](#) and exploring a potential 'UDI system' for Australia.
- The TGA also published – [Better healthcare – a vision for the use of data matrix and medicines traceability](#).
- We once again saw the innovative implementation of GS1 standards in hospitals such as Royal Prince Alfred in Sydney and in assisting the [COVID tracing process](#) in several states including ACT.
- The [Implementation guideline for use of Electronic Messaging](#) to support Pharmaceutical product clinical trials was published to further support the [Application Standard for Clinical Trials](#) that was published last year.
- [Global Health Provider webinars](#) shared insights into the adoption and benefits of GS1 standards implementation to health services around the world.
- Provided support for companies re-tooling through the COVID-19 crisis to deliver [PPE to market faster](#).
- Globally and locally we 'zoomed', 'teamed' and used many other platforms for collaborations across standards development, standards implementations, industry defined services and many other projects.
