We also strive to keep the GS1 recall portal front of mind for when you may need to execute a recall or withdrawal.

There was a total of 16 attendees, and we did meet the quorum. Quorum specifies 10 participants - 2 receivers and 5 suppliers.

2.6 Current Position of Recall Service

Report Summary of the current position of the Recall Service - delivered by Chris Drougas

Subscriber Onboarding 97% live (11 outstanding). This is those companies that have subscribed to the service but have not proceeded to on-board status. It is important for these companies to on-board and our support team have a process to assist them.

- Live notifications 15 Recalls issued this FY, 58 Withdrawals against 42 at this time last year.
- Mock recalls are comparable to last year LY 242 Q2 TD is 237 on track.
- 18 companies have issued notifications in Q2 TD. None were Recall platform users.
- If a subscriber of the Recall portal has a recall that is not issued through the portal, then we will give them a call to ensure that they have training or to see if they need any assistance.

2.7 Recall Development Roadmap

Roadmap update - delivered by Anuja Varghese – Business Analyst / Tester – Member Systems, GS1 Australia

- For 2024 there are 3 planned releases.
- R2 is scheduled for July 20th, 2024, with requirements lock down in March.
- R3 is scheduled for December 2024 with requirements lock down due in June.

Chris and his team are reviewing the requirements to see what may be added to the new releases based on feedback that they hear from their support channels.

The next releases on July 20th are currently in development testing and is being refined with developers.



Chris reviewed all the changes due to be released in April and advised that full details and descriptions of each requirement are available in the appendix of the slide deck.

Release 2: July 20th

Some simple changes will enhance the look and feel of the portal. Chris also advised that we have two separate portals, recall food & beverage and general merchandise. There are two separate platforms for the different industry sectors. The data required for the platforms are dependent on the regulatory requirements I.e.: The TGA as opposed to FSANZ etc.

2.8 Issues / Challenges / Opportunities

Melanie advised that at our last meeting there was discussion around of the number of mock recalls that go through to FSANZ which causes confusion. It was a good reminder that if you are doing a mock recall to **not** do this through the live system as there are two separate menu options now.

Another item was to advise that in April FSANZ have published the latest Australian Food Recall statistics to identify trends and common issues in the food industry and help find ways to

Klara Kinclova - Technical Manager - Sustainability, Quality & Compliance -Metcash provided an overview of the way Metcash will be using the Recall portal for their product incident management, the benefits and process of implementing this across their business. Moving from spreadsheets to the GS1 portal has created many efficiencies and they were easily able to complete their PWC Audit recently.

There was a suggestion to onboard more suppliers and to have more product data and images flow through to the portal from the GS1 National Product Catalogue (NPC) and images from the Smart Media platform.

• Woolworths 2D Barcode implementation

Melanie mentioned that the group may be aware that Woolworths are migrating to 2D barcodes on their fresh private label products. Last week they sent out communication to their private label suppliers across Australia and New Zealand regarding their planned transition to 2D Barcodes.

They are now scanning 10 million 2 D barcodes at the point of sale with 20 plus Fresh Food suppliers that are now live - it is still very early days in their journey but this represents over 1,000 products including all of their quick sale - reduced to clear items, meat and poultry and fresh salad bags as well as all internal deli items.

Woolworths have now rolled out this capability nationally across all stores for their POS systems, scanners, for their in-store processes as well as for their online picking processes.

There are some branded items as well and they are looking to incorporate batch / lot code at a future date to be able to stop the sale of a recalled/withdrawn item at the checkout. Currently they can stop the sale of an expired product which has reduced the amount of food waste in store and better enable them to manage shelf life and increase productivity.

6.0 GS1 Australia Limited Trade Practices Compliance Notice

Participants on GS1 Boards, committees, task forces, work groups, or other similar bodies, must always remember the purpose of the Board, committee task force, or work group is to enhance the ability of all industry members to compete more efficiently and effectively to provide better value to the consumer or end user. GS1 activity almost always involves the cooperation of competitors; therefore, great care must be taken to assure compliance with trade practices laws in Australia and in other jurisdictions. - Where appropriate, meetings shall be governed by an agenda prepared in advance and recorded by minutes prepared promptly after the meeting.
- Where appropriate, tests or data collection shall be governed by protocols developed by GS1 Australia.
- GS1 reserves the right to seek opinion of lawyer(s) with trade practices experience on any matter or document arising out of any GS1 activity.
- The recommendation coming out of a GS1 Board, committee, task force, work group or task group are just that. Individual companies remain free to make independent, competitive decisions.
- Any Standards developed must be voluntary standards.
