Although Germany has long had laws that restrict hate speech, on January 1, 2018, the Act to Improve Enforcement of the Law in Social Networks (NetzDG) came into effect.

This new law requires social media companies to take quick action when hate speech is published online, which is having a significant impact on how these companies operate in Germany.

Companies that do not comply with NetzDG could face fines of 50 million euro.²
