The Downing of Turkish-Russian Relations

On November 24, 2015, Turkey shot down a Russian fighter jet following an incursion into Turkish airspace along the border with Syria. The Kremlin has responded swiftly, leading to the deterioration of relations between Moscow and Ankara.

The ruble continues to depreciate and the lira sank to a record low against the dollar amid Turkish domestic political uncertainty and escalating violence



Turkey imports **60 percent** of its gas from Russia, making it one Russia's top customers
