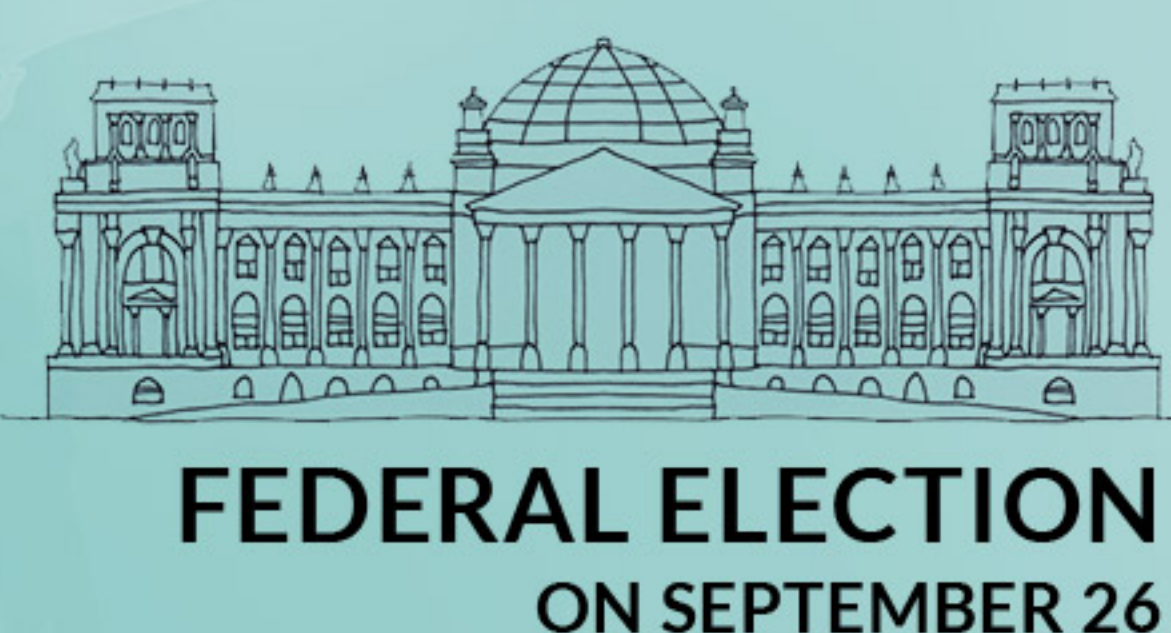


CRISIS AND CONSEQUENCES: GERMANY'S COVID-19 RESPONSE

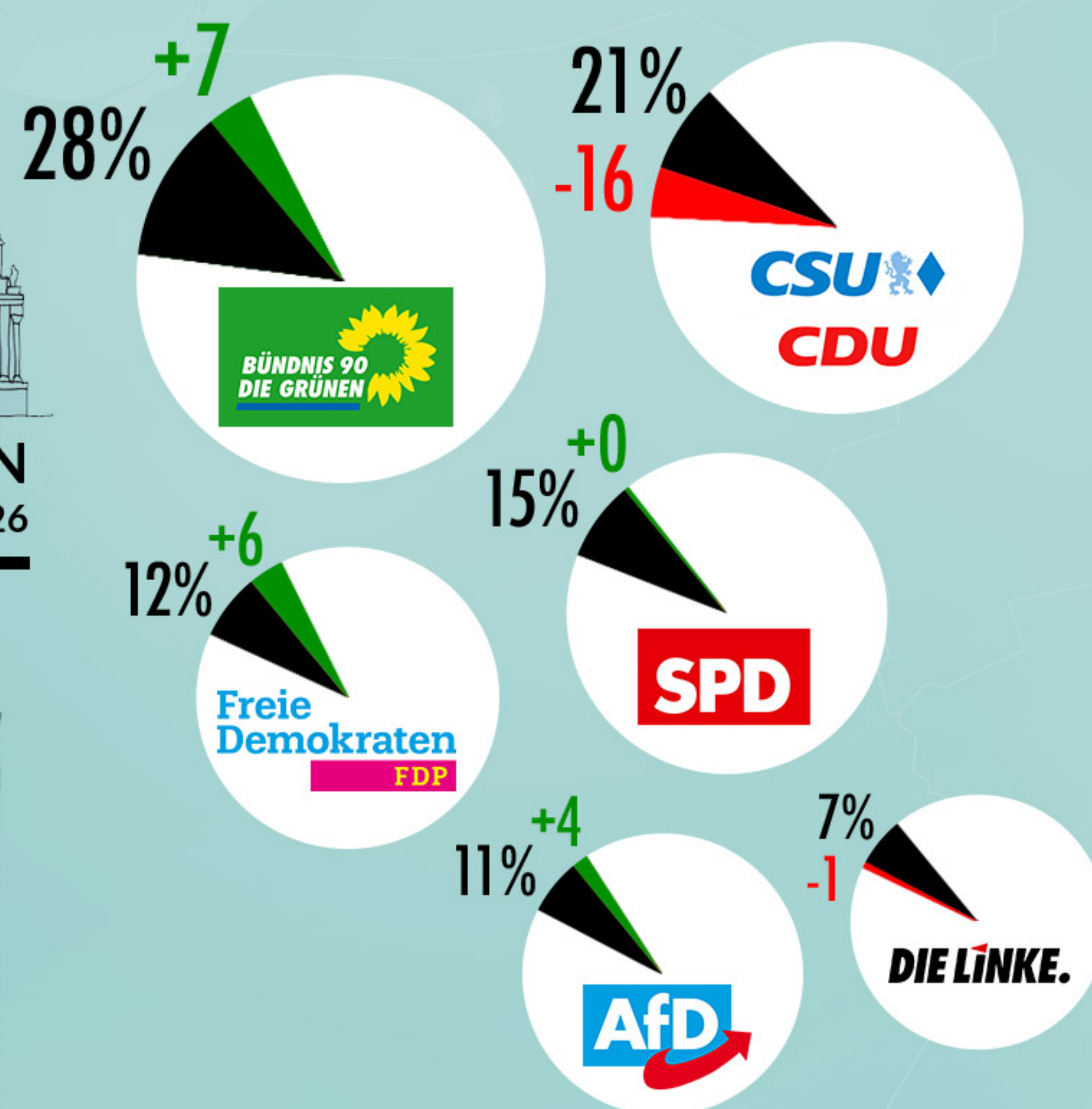

7 MAJOR ELECTIONS IN 2021

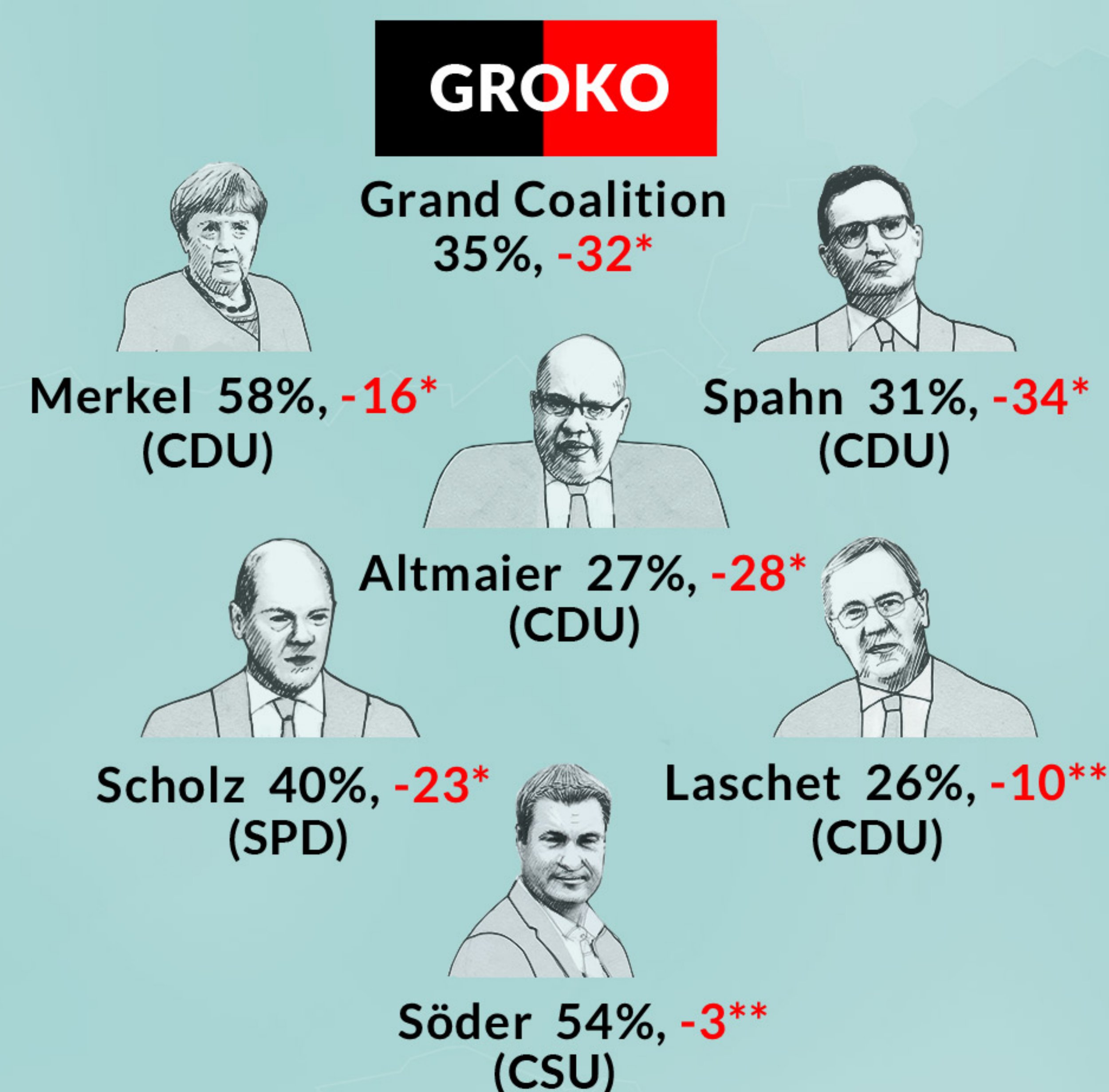


VOTING INTENTIONS
