Process for Donating Embryos to Donor Nexus

Thank you for your interest in donating your embryos to Donor Nexus. Below you will find an explanation of the process. We are happy to set up a consultation with one of our case managers to discuss the process in more detail. Please note, we do need all documents listed below prior to approving new embryo profiles.

1. Complete Donor Embryo Application and request necessary records.

Documents required by donor parents:

- Embryo Donation Application completed by donor parents.
- Copy of donor parent ID's
- Genetic Carrier Screening on both partners (if completed) or egg/sperm donor
- Egg donor/sperm donor profile and photos, if applicable
- Egg donor legal consent/agreement stating egg donor consented to embryo(s) being donated to a third part for the purpose of reproduction. If you do not have a copy of the agreement, your egg bank/agency should have a copy to provide to you.

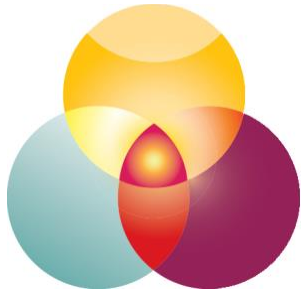
Documents required from clinic where embryo(s) were created or current long term storage facility:

- Pre-Transfer form completed by your clinic or long-term storage facility
 - Infectious Disease* or FDA Lab Results
 - FDA Gamete Summary, Physical Assessment and Questionnaire
 - Tissue Cryo Summary-including grades or test thaw as applicable
 - Thaw Protocol
 - PGD/PGS Report if applicable
- CAP Accreditation

*If embryos were created outside of California, the sperm provider may need to have an additional blood test (HTLV 1 & 2) that is required by California as part of their mandated infectious disease screens. We will facilitate this; you can go to any LabCorp location close to you.

Note: Kindly submit all paperwork an application at one time to avoid a delay in record review.

- ### 2. FDA Requirements.
- As part of the embryo donation process, the FDA requires an attempt to screen and test the gamete providers in accordance with regulations under 1271.90(a)(4) and 1271.90(b). Donor parents will have the option to either decline all testing or proceed with one or more of the following: a donor questionnaire, a physical exam with their primary care physician, and FDA infectious disease testing via an outside lab. Participation in testing is optional and will not affect the ability to donate

embryos. All decisions must be documented and signed by both the oocyte and sperm provider.

- 3. Approval Process.** Once all documents are reviewed and approved by Donor Nexus staff and embryology team, we will create a PDF profile that you will approve. The profile will be uploaded to our online database.
- 4. Consent Forms.**
 - Complete transport release and disposition consent forms through partner IVF clinic.
 - Complete Donor Nexus Agency Agreement
 - Reach out to your IVF clinic to complete any consent forms they have prior to releasing the embryo(s)
- 5. Shipping.** Donor Nexus will coordinate shipping of embryo(s) from your IVF clinic or long-term storage facility to our partner IVF clinic. If your IVF clinic charges an administration fee for releasing embryos, please notify Donor Nexus so we can pay the fee on your behalf.
- 6. Matching.** If you have requested to pre-approve potential recipients, a member of the Donor Nexus staff will reach out to you when an intended parent expresses interest.

**Importantly, there is absolutely no cost to you.
The intended parent(s) will cover all costs of the donation.**
