

1 Harpa

The concert hall and conference centre is the latest landmark in Reykjavík and houses both the Iceland Symphony Orchestra and the Icelandic Opera.

2 The Old Harbour

A colourful busy area with restaurants, shops and cafés. From here you can choose between different sailing tours.

3 Reykjavík **Maritime Museum**

Explore the world of the Icelandic fisheries and coastal culture. The former coast guard vessel Óðinn is also docked there.

4 Whales of Iceland

The biggest whale exhibition in the world! Life-sized models, an interactive installation and virtual reality experience. Fun for all ages

FlyOver Iceland

Only two minutes walk away across the street from the stop you can find FlyOver Iceland. A very popular attraction which includes a breathtaking virtual ride over Iceland.

Lava Show

The only live lava show in the world.Don't miss this unique opportunity to get up close to real molten lava, see it flowing, hear it sizzling, and feel the incredible heat that eminates from it.

National Museum of Iceland

The permanent exhibition Making of a Nation - Heritage and History in Iceland is a journey through time, from the settlement to the present day.

6 Lækjargata

Lækjargata - literally "stream street" - takes its name from the stream that once ran along the

Iceland's first real shopping mall opened its doors in 1987 and includes today over 180 shops and restaurants along with a cinema and a public library. Next to the mall is the Reykjavík City Theatre.



Hilton Nordica Reykjavík

A good start or end for guests staying in the larger hotels in this area; Grand Hotel, Reykjavik Lights, Hilton, and more. Many local companies, cafés and restaurants also reside in this area.

Laugardalur Park

Laugardalur is a major centre for sports and recreation in the capital. In Laugardalur you will find Laugardalslaug, the city's largest swimming pool. You will also find a beautiful botanical garden and the Family Park and Zoo.

Skarfabakki Harbour

From here you can take a boat tour over to Viðey island, stroll along the coastline to downtown Reykjavík or come inside and rent a vehicle for the day at Enterprise rent-a-car.

16 Höfði House

Höfði is considered to be one of the most historically significant buildings in Reykjavík. It was the location for the 1986 summit meeting of president Ronald Reagan and the general secretary Mikhail Gorbachev, in order to end the Cold War.
