## THE KITCHEN PRESENTS THE NEW YORK PREMIERE OF MELINDA RING'S *FORGETFUL SNOW*, MAY 9–17

#### Melinda Ring Forgetful Snow

A triptych composed of two durational performances and an evening-length dance, *Forgetful Snow* investigates the transcendent possibilities of body and mind. By day, performers in the installations *The Landscape* and *(Memory of) Snow Machine* labor at searching for landscapes, retrieving lost moments of time and archiving the accumulating results. These simple tasks involving the body, video, and language are quietly focused and mysterious. In the evening, the dance is performed without clothing and accompaniment to strip it of layered-on meaning and emotion. Presented instead is an intimate and formally complex choreography with elusive performative demands and textures. Ring's main collaborators for this project are performers **Talya Epstein**, **Maggie Jones**, and **Molly Lieber**. Additional performers include **Lorene Bouboushian**, **Luke George**, and **Federico Hewson**.

Performances of *Forgetful Snow* will take place May 8–10, 14–17 at 7pm at **The Kitchen**. The installations *The Landscape* and *(Memory of) Snow Machine* will be on view May 9–10, 14–17 from 3–6pm. The Kitchen is located at 512 West 19th Street in Manhattan. In her work, **Melinda Ring** explores a very liberal definition of choreography creating dances, performance pieces, videos and installations. Originally from Los Angeles, Ring moved to New York in September 2001, after receiving her MFA degree from Bennington College. She founded her current company, Special Projects, in 2004, and has been represented by The Box gallery in Los Angeles since 2008. She was the curator for Danspace Project's Spring 2011 Platform, *Susan Rethorst: Retro(intro)spective*, and their Fall 2012 Judson Now Platform program *Dance by Default*. Ring has been recently commissioned and presented by Danspace Project, The Kitchen, MASS MoCA, The Tang Teaching Museum at Skidmore College, The Whitney Biennial, Mount Tremper Arts, and the Santa Monica Museum of Art. Ring is a 2012 Headlands Center for the Arts artist-in-residence, and 2012–13 Gibney Dance Center DiP Resident Artist.
