e.g. The eerie wood had trees as tall as towerblocks



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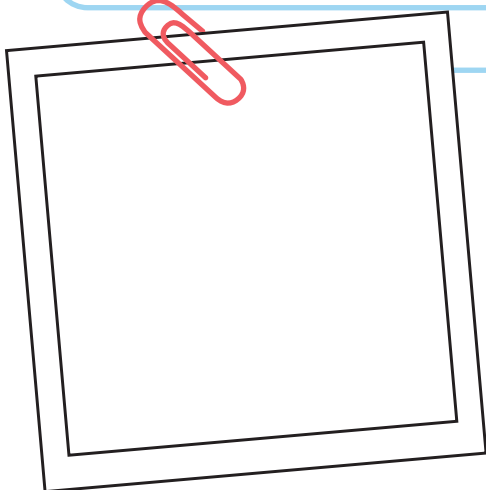
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Now it's time to plan your own setting.
