Activity 1

When you first read a text you may not understand all of the vocabulary. You can use context clues to understand the meaning of unknown words. Context clues are hints the author has used in the text to help explain more challenging words.

Top Tip: look out for synonyms (words of similar meaning).

A thesaurus can help you with this challenge.

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Activity 2

- Suffixes are letters added the end of a word, e.g. 'viewing'.

You need to include the following words in your letter:


- occupation
