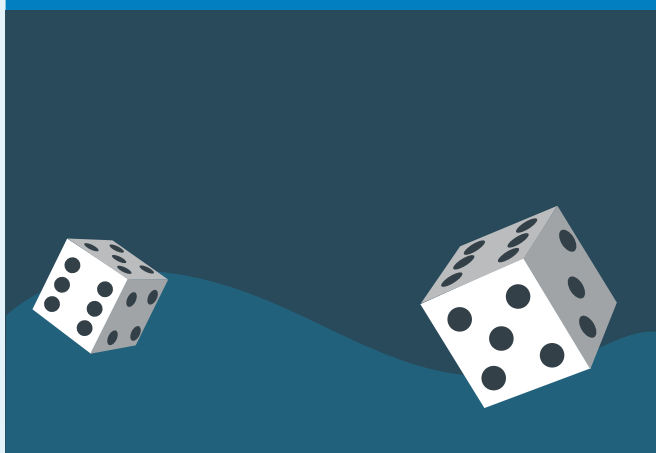

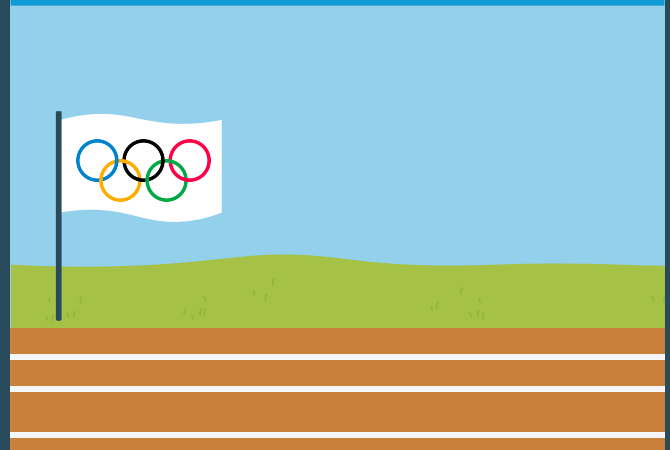


So You Think You Can Sell?
